PROPOSED REGULATION OF THE NEVADA INTERSCHOLASTIC ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION

EXPLANATION - Matter in *italics* is new; matter in brackets for material is material to be omitted.

Definition of Tournament - Proposed For Inclusion As NAC 386.6201

"Tournament" means a series of games, contests or meets, as defined in NAC 386.608, scheduled by the Association between member schools or by a school for any of its teams or pupils who participate in a sanctioned sport. A "tournament" shall not exceed six consecutive days excluding Sunday. NAC 386.816.

- **386.779** General requirements for eligibility of pupil. (NRS 386.430) A pupil is eligible to participate or practice in a sanctioned sport if the pupil:
- 1. Is enrolled in the 9th, 10th, 11th or 12th grade in a school where he or she is registered to participate in the sanctioned sport;
 - 2. Resides within the zone of attendance of the school in accordance with NAC 386.782;
- (a) A pupil in the 9th grade who enrolls at a private school who did not attend a private middle school or elementary school for 180 school days immediately prior to enrollment in the private school shall be ineligible for 180 school days at the private school at the varsity level in accordance with NAC 386.798.
- (b) A pupil in the 9th grade who enrolls at a public school who did not attend a public middle or junior high school within the zone of attendance of the public school for 180 school days immediately prior to enrollment in the public school shall be ineligible for 180 school days at the public school at the varsity level in accordance with NAC 386.798.
- 3. Complies with the regulations of the Association, the school and the school district that has jurisdiction over the school relating to eligibility to participate in a sanctioned sport;
 - 4. Has not received a high school diploma or general equivalency diploma;
- 5. Is not enrolled full-time at a college, junior college or other postsecondary educational institution:
- 6. Has not participated on an athletic team of a college, junior college or other postsecondary educational institution; and
 - 7. Has not participated in a sanctioned sport as a professional athlete.

386.784 Presumption of ineligibility of pupil who transfers to another school. (NRS 386.430)

- 1. Any pupil who transfers to another school is presumed ineligible to participate in any sanctioned sport at the school to which the pupil transfers for 180 school days.
 - 2. The presumption set forth in subsection 1 applies to a pupil who transfers from:
- (a) A school to another school within the same school district that has established zones of attendance for pupils who reside within that school district;
 - (b) A school district to another school district; or

- (c) A public school to a private school, a private school to a public school or a private school to another private school within the zone of attendance.
- 3. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 4, a pupil or a parent or legal guardian of the pupil may rebut the presumption set forth in subsection 1 [if he or she complies with the provisions of NAC 386.785 and 386.786.] by filing an appeal pursuant to NAC 386.850 through NAC 386.855.
- 4. A pupil or a parent or legal guardian of a pupil may not rebut the presumption set forth in subsection 1 if the pupil transferred to another school within 1 year after the pupil:
- (a) Participated in an athletic event as a member of a team that is affiliated with the school to which he or she transferred, including, without limitation, an athletic event sponsored or conducted by the Amateur Athletic Union, the American Legion or a similar organization specified by the Executive Director; or
 - (b) Received any athletic instruction from a person who is affiliated with that school.

386.861 Imposition of additional penalties by Association or Executive Director or during appeal; approval of suspension by Board. (NRS 386.430)

- 1. In addition to any penalty set forth in NAC 386.600 to 386.886, inclusive, the Association may impose any of the following penalties for a violation of a provision of those sections:
- (a) The issuance of a sanction indicating the occurrence of misconduct and the imposition of a fine not to exceed \$1000.00;
- (b) The placement of a school on probation and the imposition of a fine not to exceed \$2500.00;
- (c) The suspension of the membership of a school in the Association *and a fine not to exceed \$5000.00*; or
 - (d) The imposition of a fine of not more than \$1,000.
- 2. The Association will maintain a record of each sanction *and fine* issued pursuant to paragraph (a) of subsection 1. If a school that is issued a sanction *and fine* repeats the violation for which the sanction *and fine* is issued, the Association may suspend the membership of the school in the Association for the period specified by the Board pursuant to subsection 4.
- 3. A school that is placed on probation pursuant to paragraph (b) of subsection 1 may not participate in any activity relating to a league, regional or state tournament for the period determined by the Association. If the school repeats the violation for which the school was placed on probation, the Association will *impose a fine* suspend the membership of the school in the Association for the period specified by the Board pursuant to subsection 4.
- 4. The Executive Director, an administrator or a panel specified in NAC 386.852 may, during an appeal made pursuant to NAC 386.850 to 386.858, inclusive, suspend or impose a penalty/*fine* against a school that is a party to the appeal. A suspension imposed pursuant to this section is not final until the Board approves the imposition and duration of the suspension.
- 5. If a penalty is imposed or disciplinary action is taken against a school or pupil, the Executive Director may, in addition to the penalty imposed or disciplinary action taken, impose a penalty against the school or pupil pursuant to this section.

386.883 Fees for approving requests to broadcast: Amount; obligations of person paying fee; waiver of fee. (NRS 386.430)

- 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 3, *prior to a game, contest, meet or match*, the Board shall charge and collect the following fees [for] before approving a request to broadcast by television, radio, webcast video, webcast audio, or webcast combination of video and audio of regular season games, contest, meets or matches and for a league, regional or state tournament [by radio or television:] games, contests, meets or matches:
- (a) For a live broadcast by [television] webcast cast video of a [league or regional tournament:] game, contest, meet or match; 1A/2A/3A/4A

- 2. If a person pays a fee to broadcast a league, regional or state tournament pursuant to this section, the Board:
- (a) Shall require the person to include in the broadcast a public service announcement for the Association; and
- (b) May require the person to include in the broadcast any information that is provided by a sponsor of the Association.
 - 3. If a school:
- (a) Operates a station for broadcasting by radio or television games, contests or meets for sanctioned sports in which the school participates; and
 - (b) Wishes to broadcast a league, regional or state tournament using that station,
- Ê the Board may waive the fee required pursuant to subsection 1 for broadcasting the tournament if, as determined by the Board, the waiver of the fee is in the best interests of the Association and the tournament.
