INFORMATIONAL STATEMENT

The following statement is submitted for adopted amendments to Nevada Administrative Code 391:

1. A description of how public comment was solicited, a summary of public response, and explanation how other interested persons may obtain a copy of the summary.

Notice of Workshop to Solicit Comments on Proposed Regulations was sent to approximately 200 individuals and educational organizations. A workshop was held on May 14, 2010 and October 8, 2010. There was written public comment on May 14, 2010.

The Notice of Intent to Act Upon a Regulation for public hearing and adoption of the Temporary New Regulation for Common Core Standards for English Language Arts and Common Core Standards for Mathematics (Final Version). A public hearing was conducted on December 10, 2010 to provide the opportunity for comments by affected parties and the public. There was no public comment. The State Board of Education adopted the proposed temporary regulation.

3. A description of how comment was solicited from affected businesses, a summary of the response and an explanation how other interested parties may obtain a copy of the summary.

Comments were solicited through the workshop notice of April 21, 2010, a workshop notice of September 22, 2010, and a public hearing notice of November 4, 2010. At the May 14, 2010 Workshop to Solicit Comments, there was written public comment to the proposed temporary regulation. At the December 10, 2010 public hearings there was no public comment to the proposed temporary regulation.

Workshop comments:

1. Paul B. Richter, Director of Assessment, Washoe County School District submitted written comment at the May 14, 2010, Workshop: Washoe County School District supports the full adoption of the Common Core Standards in Mathematics and English Language Arts and further recommends that Nevada not enhance them further. After vigorous review of the Common Core Standards by WCSD teacher groups, curriculum content experts and representatives of both the University of Nevada, Reno and Truckee Meadows Community College, we find the standards sufficiently rigorous as they stand.

The Nevada State Board of Education adopted the proposed temporary regulation language at the public hearing held December 10, 2010. The reason for adopting the temporary regulation is to align the Common Core Standards in English Language Arts and Mathematics with the National Standards.

There is no economic effect of the regulation on the business it regulates.

There is no cost to the Department of Education to adopt these regulations. There is no federal law affecting the proposed regulations.
