COMMISSION GENERAL REGULATION 426

NOTICE OF INTENT TO ACT UPON A REGULATION

Notice of Hearing for The (Adoption/Amendment/Repeal) of Regulations of The Nevada Board of Wildlife Commissioners

The Board of Wildlife Commissioners will hold a public hearing on March 16, 2013 at 8:00 a.m., at the TBD, Reno, Nevada 89512. The purpose of the hearing is to receive comments from all interested persons regarding the adoption of regulation CGR 426 – LCB File No. T004-13 pertaining to Chapter 503 of the Nevada Administrative Code.

- 1. The need for and purpose of the proposed regulation: (Description of regulation). A regulation relating to wildlife, amending regulations to allow possession of only one captive desert tortoise after May 1, 2013; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.
- 2. Text of the proposed regulation: See attached.
- 3A. The estimated economic effect of the regulation on the business which it is to regulate:
 - (a) Adverse effect No adverse economic effect to businesses is anticipated from this amended regulation as the desert tortoise is a threatened species and therefore cannot be commercially collected or marketed within the State. There are no new fees associated with this regulation.
 - (b) Beneficial effect No beneficial economic effect to businesses is anticipated from this amended regulation as the desert tortoise is a threatened species and therefore cannot be commercially collected or marketed within the State.
 - (c) Immediate effect No immediate economic effect to businesses is anticipated from this regulation.
 - (d) Long-term effect No long-term economic effect to businesses is anticipated from this regulation.
- 3B. The estimated economic effect of the regulation on the public which it is to regulate:
 - (a) Adverse effect No adverse economic effect on the public is anticipated from this amended regulation.
 - (b) Beneficial effect This amended regulation is anticipated to gradually diminish the over breeding and proliferation of unwanted pet desert tortoises in southern Nevada. This will decrease the need for public funding to pick up and care for

- unwanted pet tortoises. This amended regulation will not impact existing pet desert tortoise custodians.
- (c) Immediate effect This amended regulation will allow possession of only one captive desert tortoise after May 1, 2013, which will reduce the over breeding and proliferation of unwanted pet desert tortoises in southern Nevada.
- (d) Long-term effect In the long-term, this amended regulation will diminish the over breeding and proliferation of unwanted pet desert tortoises in southern Nevada, and will decrease the need for public funding to pick up and care for unwanted pet tortoises.
- 4. Estimated cost to the Department of Wildlife for enforcement of the proposed regulation: Enforcement and monitoring will be included in existing programs. There will be no additional costs to the Department for enforcement of the proposed regulations.

 The language in the amended regulation is not required by federal law, but NDOW is cooperating closely with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service to implement this amended regulation to gradually diminish the over breeding and proliferation of unwanted pet desert tortoises in southern Nevada.

 This amended regulation will allow possession of only one captive desert tortoise after May 1, 2013. The language in the amended regulation is not required by federal law, but NDOW is cooperating closely with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service to implement this amended regulation to gradually diminish the over breeding and proliferation of unwanted pet desert tortoises in southern Nevada. This amended regulation will not impact existing pet desert tortoise custodians.

Chapter 503 of NAC

PROPOSED TEMPORARY REGULATION OF THE BOARD OF WILDLIFE COMMISSIONERS

LCB File No. T004-13

EXPLANATION – Matter in *italics* is new; matter in brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

AUTHORITY: §§1-3, NRS 501.105 and 501.181.

A REGULATION relating to desert tortoises; prohibiting a person from possessing more than one desert tortoise under certain circumstances; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Section 1. NAC 503.093 is hereby amended to read as follows:

- 503.093 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, a person shall not hunt or take any wildlife which is classified as protected, or possess any part thereof, without first obtaining the appropriate license, permit or written authorization from the Department.
 - 2. Such a license, permit or authorization is not required for:
 - (a) The possession of a desert tortoise which:
 - (1) Was held in captivity on or before August 4, 1989; or
- (2) Is acquired through an adoption program *or another method* approved by the United States Fish and Wildlife Service.
 - (b) The possession of any species of wildlife classified as protected in Nevada which is:
 - (1) Lawfully killed in another state and imported to Nevada; and
- (2) Possessed under the authority of the other state's appropriate license, tag, permit or other authorization.
 - (c) The taking of a protected vector or a protected venomous reptile:
 - (1) Which is found in a residence, school or other building open to the public; or
- (2) If the taking is necessary to protect the life of any person in imminent danger of being attacked or bitten by the protected vector or protected venomous reptile.
- 3. A person possessing a desert tortoise pursuant to subparagraph 2 of paragraph (a) of subsection 2 shall not possess more than one desert tortoise and shall not allow that desert tortoise to physically contact another desert tortoise.
 - **4.** As used in this section:
- (a) "Classified as protected" includes wildlife that is classified as sensitive, threatened or endangered.
- (b) "Vector" means a living nonhuman animal capable of carrying infectious disease from one person or animal to another.
- **Sec. 2.** The amendatory provisions of section 1 of this regulation do not apply to a person who acquires a desert tortoise specified in subparagraph (2) of paragraph (a) of subsection 2 of that section before January 1, 2013.
 - **Sec. 3.** This regulation becomes effective on January 1, 2013.
