Statistical Profile of Nevada Senate District No. 14 of the 77th Session (2013)

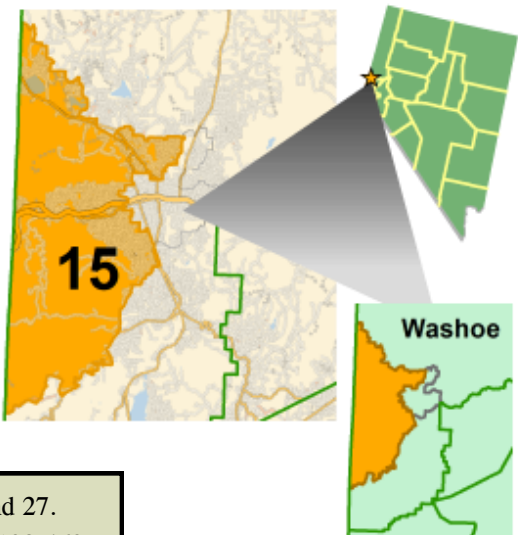

of the 77th Session (2013)



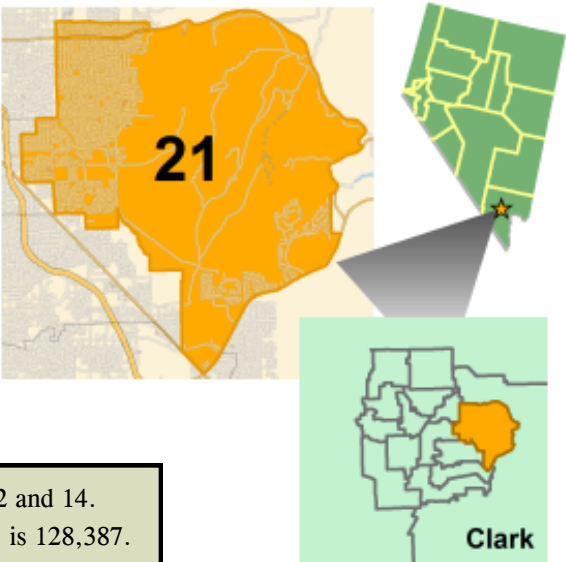
