The population database is derived from the 2020 Census Public Law 94-171 Redistricting Data as provided by the U.S. Census Bureau and validated by the Legislative Counsel Bureau. These numbers will be revised for redistricting to reflect the reallocation of inmates to their last known residential address prior to incarceration, rather than the address of the facility in which they are incarcerated on Census day, pursuant to AB450 of the 2019 Legislative Session. Thus, the numbers for each entity may change to reflect this reallocation.
