Pursuant to Section 11 of [Senate Bill \(SB\) 4](#), of the 36th (2025) Special Legislative Session, the Nevada Health Authority (NVHA) submits this report for transmittal to the Joint Interim Standing Committee on Health and Human Services of the grants awarded under this program to provide education and enrollment assistance related to Nevada Medicaid and the Public Option program. Subsection 1 provided an appropriation of \$2,000,000 to the Interim Finance Committee for the Nevada Health Authority (NVHA) to award grants, using a Request for Proposal (RFP) process to community-based organizations.

This document is meant to serve as the State Fiscal Year 2026 report to the Joint Interim Standing Committee on Health and Human Services regarding the community-based organization grant program.

On Friday, May 1, 2026, the Division of Consumer Health Services (DCHS) at NVHA released a Request for Applications (RFA) that outlined grant program requirements and included detailed guidance on how eligible community-based organizations could apply for the funding opportunity. NVHA is using these grant funds to place Exchange Enrollment Facilitators (EEFs) within a wide range of community-based settings to offer direct, in-person education and enrollment assistance to consumers applying for coverage under NVHA programs.

Under this funding, community-based organizations will focus on the following priorities: increasing successful enrollment and reenrollment in Medicaid and Qualified Health Plans (QHPs) to reduce coverage gaps and churn; providing direct, in-person education and assistance to Medicaid members to understand and comply with new federal Medicaid work requirements, reducing coverage terminations related to procedural issues; helping navigate eligibility processes; expanding assistance for vulnerable and hard to reach populations, improving health insurance literacy; and strengthening post-enrollment support systems to ensure members and consumers maintain coverage.

The RFA was officially published on May 1 and had an application deadline of May 29, 2026. In total, 35 applications were received requesting over \$8,000,000 in funding. Formal evaluations were conducted by a committee composed of representatives from the NVHA Director's Office, the Division of Consumer Health Services, the Division of Nevada Medicaid, and the Division of Social Services to determine recommendations for grant award allocation to eligible community-based organizations.

In total, the Evaluation committee recommended funding for 16 community-based organizations, with 30 new EEFs statewide, for a total funding amount of \$1,961,861.74.

The remaining \$38,138.26 will be awarded at a later date to achieve full execution of appropriated funds.

As outlined in SB4, subsection 2, NVHA submitted a ranked list of grant award allocations for approval to the Interim Finance Committee via work program C81997 to be placed on the August 13, 2026 agenda. Upon work program approval, the NVHA will release Notice of Awards to each funded entity, with a grant period of September 1, 2026 to June 30, 2027. The NVHA is also exploring federal match of these funds and if approved, will bring forward a work program for the Interim Finance Committee's consideration.

The DCHS and NVHA are excited to implement this new grant program and are grateful for the opportunity to expand our partnerships with community-based organizations to support continued eligibility, enrollment and coverage efforts to Nevadans.
