Governor Lombardo:

Following is this Board's report in compliance with Executive Order 2023-004. If you have any questions regarding this report, please contact Margi Grein, Executive Officer, at (702) 486-1111.

The Nevada State Contractors Board was created in 1941 to protect the Nevada public health, safety, and welfare by assuring that Nevada's contractors are properly trained and competent through licensure, regulation, and enforcement of Nevada law. As of December 31, 2022, the Board licenses 17,376 active contracting businesses and an additional 487 inactive contracting businesses. The Board holds twelve regular meetings per year. Additionally, the Board members attend numerous committee meetings for the Board's standing and *ad hoc* committees. The Board's practice act is found at NRS ch. 624, and the Board has promulgated regulations that may be found at NAC ch. 624.

Section 1 - Regulations, Fees and Cost, Examinations and Other Requirements for Licensure

NRS 624.005 declares that the NRS chapter 624 was created to "promote public confidence and trust in the competence and integrity of licensees and to protect the health, safety and welfare of the public."

The Board's regulations are divided into twelve sections:

- (1) General Provisions;
- (2) State Contractors' Board;
- (3) Investigations Office;
- (4) Classifications;
- (5) Licenses;
- (6) Certificates of Eligibility;

- (7) General Building Contractors: Required Disclosures;
- (8) Work concerning Residential Pools and Spas;
- (9) Disciplinary Action and Practice Before the Board;
- (10) Complaints Seeking Recovery;
- (11) Questions and Disputes Concerning Constructional Defects; and
- (12) Commission on Construction Education.

In every case, the regulations were promulgated with the intent to address with specificity issues related to licensure requirements, licensure renewal, professional standards expected of Nevada's contractors, various special areas addressed by specific legislation that are within the unique purview of the Board.

Following is a list of each regulations relative to licensure requirements in order to receive a contractor's license in the State of Nevada.

Examinations

Nevada's construction examination program is developed and administered by PSI Services, LLC, a nationally recognized firm in the licensure examination industry. Nevada's program includes 76 titles ranging from residential and commercial subcontracting disciplines to larger more complex engineering and building disciplines. Exams are developed using professional standards for validity, reliability, and fairness to ensure the program is psychometrically sound and legally defensible. Both the nationally accredited exam and state specific exams may be taken at any PSI owned and operated exam administration site throughout the United States.

With the enactment of NRS 622.530 in 2017, the NSCB expanded licensure by endorsement opportunities be recognizing substantially similar trade exams from 12 other states as outlined in <u>Attachment A</u>

Fees

The fee for submittal of an application for a contractor's license, biennial license fee and examination fee are established pursuant to the provisions of NRS 624.280. Following is a table of the authorized fee, current fee and date of the last fee increase.

NRS 624.470 authorizes the establishment of a Residential Recovery Fund, which is funded by assessments paid by residential contractors. Except as provided in NRS 624.540, the money in the Recovery Fund account must be used to pay claims made by injured persons as provided in NRS 624.400 to 624.560, inclusive.

Other Costs

Other costs associated with licensure may include financial statement preparation, bonding, and compliance with industrial insurance requirements.

Section 2 - Justification and State Analysis

Each of the regulations listed in section 1 were enacted based on the statutory provisions and mandates set forth in NRS ch. 624 and ch. 622. Applicable enabling statutes are identified in section 1.

Commercial and/or residential construction licensing is required by a majority of states and is primarily regulated by licensing boards/agencies or registration boards/agencies. The following summary is based on data provided by the National Association of State Contractors Licensing Agencies detailed in <u>Attachment B</u>

10 State Registration Boards/Agencies

8 States Have Local Licensing Requirements

Section 3 - Recommended Revisions

Contractor's licenses in Nevada are issued to business entities that enter into contracts with consumers to perform the work of a contractor as defined in NRS 624.020. The Nevada State Contractors Board does not license individual construction workers employed by those companies.

The Nevada State Contractors Board's annual strategic planning and its participation in various focus groups and committees have resulted in ongoing initiatives to improve and streamline services. Over the past several years, the NSCB has implemented a number of measures to streamline licensure resulting from legislative, regulatory and procedural changes. These measures have included; licensure by endorsement (SB 69 2017), experience consideration and validation (AB 25 2019, AB 330 2021, LCB File R021-21; LCB File R023-19, programs for Veterans

(AB 25 2019, LCB File R023-19), expanded test delivery sites outside of Nevada, and streamlined criminal background checks.

The following recommendations are provided in order to further streamline licensure:

- Revisit the provisions of NAC 624.593 concerning required types of financial statements.
- Review the provisions of NAC 624.590 concerning acceptable methods or forms of experience verification.
- Consolidate the provisions of NAC 624.150 (13) and NAC 624.480 which would provide for the elimination of NAC 624.480.
- Eliminate NAC 624.540 as these scopes of work are separately provided for in NAC 624.190 and NAC 624.380.

Additionally, the State of Nevada should consider adopting national use of LiveScan submittals from anywhere in the US which would eliminate the need to collect and process fingerprint cards and fees from applicants outside the State of Nevada. This measure would save processing time, provide convenience for applicants, and eliminate the potential for rejection of print cards.

<u>Section 4 – Summary of State Reciprocity and Endorsement Programs</u>

The Nevada State Contractors Board has limited reciprocal trade exam waiver agreements with the states of Arizona, California and Louisiana.

Our licensure by endorsement program recognizes experience, qualifications, and successful completion of an appropriate examination for applicants who have held an active license in the endorsing state for the past four years and have not been investigated for misconduct or subject to disciplinary action. Because the licensure of contracting varies widely from state to state, the Board's staff undertook a state-by-state review to find where licensure in Nevada by endorsement might be possible. The states and practice areas ultimately recognized in the endorsement program were selected based on substantial similarity following a review of the defined scopes of practice in each state, examination program providers, and exam development methodology standards, and content subject matter.

ATTACHMENT A

Licensure by Endorsement Program

Licensure by Endorsement

Under certain circumstances the Nevada State Contractors Board will waive the state specific trade examination requirement and the experience certification process requirement for applicants that qualify for licensure by endorsement. These waivers are granted for applicants who are licensed in states determined by Nevada to have substantially equivalent requirements.

In order to apply for licensure by endorsement, you will need to have been actively licensed in the endorsing state for the past four (4) years and not have had any disciplinary actions, suspension or sanctions against your license.

If your endorsing state does not offer an equivalent trade examination, you will be required to pass the state specific examination in Nevada.

Please review the state license equivalency chart to determine if you are eligible to be relieved of the trade examination and experience certification requirement based on endorsement by another state.

Your qualified individual will be required to pass the Nevada Business and Law examination.

How to Apply for Licensure by Endorsement

- Review the State License Equivalency Chart to determine your eligibility.
- Contact your endorsing state and have them complete the Request for Verification of License form.
- Include the completed form with your application at the time of submittal.
- Include the required information about your license on the application form in the section titled Licensure by Endorsement.

NASCLA Accredited Examination

If you have passed the NASCLA Commercial General Building Contractor Examination, Nevada will waive the
state specific trade examination if you are applying for a general building classification. You may verify your
passing score by accessing NASCLA's National Examination Database (NED) to purchase and electronically send
your transcript to the Board.

Note: Licensure by endorsement applies only to the trade examination requirement and/or the experience qualification requirement. All other required documentation must be provided with your application.
