Women in the Nevada Legislature

In 2019, Nevada had the first female-majority state legislature in the nation, with women holding 52 percent of legislative seats. Women again made up a majority of the Nevada Legislature in 2021, holding 60 percent of seats, including 48 percent in the Senate and 67 percent in the Assembly. In 2023 and 2025, women made up a record 62 percent of the Legislature overall, and held a majority of seats in both legislative Houses (62 percent in each).





In the last 20 years, the number of women in the Nevada Legislature has ranged from 18 (2011 and 2013) to 39 (2023 and 2025). From 2013 to the present, female legislative membership has more than doubled.

Committee with a female majority in each House:

Assembly Committee on the State Library, 1923 (but not chaired by a woman); and Senate Committee on Commerce and Labor, 1995 (also not chaired by a woman)

Woman to serve on the appropriations committee in each House:

Maude Frazier (D-Clark), Assembly Committee on Ways and Means, 1955 Diana Glomb (D-Washoe), Senate Committee on Finance, 1991

Woman to chair the appropriations committee in each House:

Bernice Mathews (D-Washoe), Co-Chair, Senate Committee on Finance, 2009 Debbie Smith (D-Washoe), Chair, Assembly Committee on Ways and Means, 2011

Woman inducted into the Senate Hall of Fame:
