BRIEFING ON TRANSPORTATION TOPICS

Edgar J. Roberts is the Director of the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) and has held his current position since December of 2008. He has worked for the Department for over 12 years. Mr. Roberts was previously the administrator of the Motor Carrier Division within DMV. He has bachelor degrees in general studies and business, with minors in finance and economics from the University of Nevada, Reno.

Farrokh Hormazdi is the Deputy Director of DMV and has held his current position at DMV since February of 2009. He has also worked at the Department of Employment, Training and Rehabilitation and Nevada's Department of Transportation (NDOT). Mr. Hormazdi has a bachelor of business administration degree and a master of accountancy from the University of Oklahoma, Norman.

Deborah Cook is the Chief of Administration for the DMV and has held her current position at the DMV since June of 2009. She has worked for the Department for over 19 years. Besides DMV, Ms. Cook has also worked for the Supreme Court Administrative Office of the Courts, Welfare, and the Department of Administration. Ms. Cook has an associate of applied science accounting degree from Western Nevada Community College in Carson City, Nevada.

Susan Martinovich is the Director for NDOT, where she has worked for over 27 years. Prior to being Director, she served as Deputy Director/Chief Engineer. Ms. Martinovich has a bachelor's degree in civil engineering from the University of Nevada, Reno, and is a licensed professional engineer in Nevada and California. She currently serves as the American Association of State Highways and Transportation Officials (AASHTO) president, is on the National Academy of Sciences Transportation Research Board Executive Committee as well as many other national committees in the areas of safety, research, and policy initiatives.

Scott Rawlins is the Deputy Director and Chief Engineer for NDOT. Mr. Rawlins is responsible for assisting the Director in the daily operations of the Department and serves as Chief Engineer for the State. Mr. Rawlins has been instrumental in the development of the Department's Pioneer Program focused on innovative project delivery methods. He is Chairman of the AASHTO Subcommittee on Systems Operations and Management and is a member of the AASHTO Standing Committee on Highways. Mr. Rawlins received a bachelor of science degree in civil engineering from the University of Nevada, Reno, and is a registered professional engineer in Nevada and California.

Rudy Malfabon is the Deputy Director for Southern Nevada for NDOT since 2003. Mr. Malfabon has served on two research panels for the National Cooperative Highway Research Program, dealing primarily with construction management issues. In his current position, Mr. Malfabon oversees NDOT's District Engineers and the Civil Rights Program. He seeks to improve communication, coordination, and customer service with local agency partners, elected officials, and the general public. Mr. Malfabon is a civil engineer graduate from the University of Nevada, Reno, and is a registered professional engineer in Nevada and Washington.
