Daniel J. Klaich was appointed by the Board of Regents to serve as the Nevada System of Higher Education's (NSHE) tenth Chancellor on June 18, 2009. He previously held the positions of Executive Vice Chancellor, Vice Chancellor for Legal Affairs and Administration, and Chief Counsel. Mr. Klaich is an attorney, admitted to the bar in Nevada and California, and practiced law privately for almost 30 years prior to joining the NSHE. He is a native Nevadan and a 1972 graduate of the University of Nevada, Reno, with a bachelor of science degree in accounting. Mr. Klaich received his juris doctorate degree from the University of Washington School of Law in 1975, and he received a master's degree in taxation from New York University in 1978. Mr. Klaich served on the Board of Regents of the NSHE from 1983 to 1997, including two terms as Chairman of the Board. He is also a member of Nevada's Board of Economic Development and the P-16 Advisory Council.

Todd Butterworth is a native of Wisconsin and moved to Nevada in 1987 after graduating from college. He joined the LCB in 2012 after serving 20 years in various management positions with the State of Nevada. Todd holds a bachelor's degree in accounting from Arizona State University and a master's of business administration from the University of Nevada, Reno.
