Dear Director Combs:

Pursuant to NRS 439.877 Centennial Hills Hospital Medical Center, is required to annually submit to your office a summary of its Patient Safety Committee Activities including information relating to the development, revision and usage of patient safety checklists and patient safety policies and a summary of the annual review conducted for the prior 12 month period. The following information is being provided in conformity with this requirement.

Establishment of Patient Safety Checklists: Pursuant to the provisions of NRS 439.877 the Patient Safety Committee adopted Patient Safety Checklists. These checklists are reviewed and modified as necessary based upon outcome and performance data on a yearly basis. Currently, Centennial Hills Hospital Medical Center utilizes and monitors compliance with checklists covering numerous patient areas.

All checklists in place were reviewed and approved for use by the Patient Safety Committee in June 2018. There were amendments to some existing document formats as indicated in the chart below as recommended by the Patient Safety Committee.
