SafeVoice Implementation Report**

“(c) On or before July 1 of each year, submit to the Director of the Legislative Counsel Bureau for transmittal to the Legislative Committee on Education a report containing a summary of the information reported to the Director pursuant to section 5 of this act during the immediately preceding 12 months and any other information that the Director determines would assist the Committee to evaluate the Program.”

Review of the Implementation of SafeVoice in Cohort 1 Schools

All schools in cohort 1 were successfully trained and given marketing materials for the students. This worked quite well as determined by the number of tips from cohort 1 schools.

Cohort 1: Washoe Areas 3&5; Clark Performance Zones 1,5,7,8,9,10,15; Churchill, Douglas, Elko, Lander, Lyon, Mineral, Nye, Storey school districts.

Next steps

Core to achieving the goal of safety for all students in Nevada school districts, the Department will pursue the following marketing objectives:

- Achieve 25,000 downloads by June 30, 2019
- Average 300 tips per month by June 30, 2019

Enhance students’ perception of both emotional and physical safety at school.

Required Data Reporting

Senate Bill 212 (2017) amended the provisions of NRS 388 to include required quarterly reports provided to the Director of the Office for a Safe and Respectful Learning Environment. Information that is reported includes but is not limited to:

- (a) The most frequent days of the week on which reports are made;*
- (b) The most frequent times of the day for making reports;*
- (c) The types of dangerous, violent or unlawful activity that are reported and the frequency of reports of each type of dangerous, violent or unlawful activity;*
- (d) The frequency with which reports are submitted using the hotline, Internet website, mobile telephone application and text messaging application, respectively; and*
- (e) The outcome of reports;*
