<sup>\*</sup>NCS has contracted with Optum for SFY 2019, and therefore prescription expenditures illustrate one twelfth of the transfer of funds to DHHS for the NCS contract. Actual expenditure will be trued up after the close of the fiscal year.

The Senior and Disability Rx Program was established pursuant to NRS 439.630(1) c in July 2010, and currently serves 2,953 seniors and 317 individuals with a disability. Prescription drug costs are covered by this program when an eligible member is in the Medicare Part-D coverage gap. Some members may also receive a subsidy toward their Medicare Part-D premiums, when applicable. There is currently no waitlist for services within this program.

As of Q1 SFY19 this report has been revised to provide data for each individual month of the quarter, whereas in previous reports the data provided was a point in time of the last month in the quarter.

For SFY19, the annual direct-services budget for the Senior and Disability Rx Program is \$2,577,198.00 The expenditures for the first quarter of the SFY are \$274,214.30 or 10.6% of the budgeted amount.
