This was amendment No. 1604. Amendment 1631 was read as follows: Amend section 1, page 1, by deleting lines 12 through 16 and inserting: "or pay for beauty supplies for use in the course of study or in practical training: (b) Rules prohibiting schools from deducting earned hours of school credit as a punishment for misbehavior of a student: (c) Rules providing for lunch and coffee recesses for students during school hours; and (d) A rule requiring the presence of a licensed instructor during all hours of study or practical training."

No action was taken.

Chairman brought up AB 592 for discussion next, an act which amends laws relating to cosmetology licenses, schools and establishments. Executive estimate of cost: None.

After some discussion Mrs. Foote moved and seconded that we indefinitely postpone AB 592.

Motion seconded.

Motion carried.

AB 462, a bill which authorizes adoption of rules governing schools of cosmetology and prohibiting unconsciounable contracts.

Assemblyman May moved "do pass".

Motion seconded.

Motion carried.

Next on the agenda was AB 686 which increases educational requirements for cosmotology license.

Mr. Homermoved to "do pass" AB 686.

Motion seconded.

Motion carried.

Discussion was held on AB 687 which relates to hairpieces as cosmetics.

Mrs. Foote moved to "do pass" AB 687.

Motion seconded.

Motion carried.

AB 688 which provides restrictions for styling hairpieces was briefly discussed.

Chairman Wilson next brought up \underline{AB} $\underline{689}$ which limits terms of cosmetology board members.

Dr. Homer moved "do pass" on AB 689.
Motion seconded.
