

MINUTES OF MEETING - HEALTH AND WELFARE COMMITTEE - 55TH ASSEMBLY
SESSION, APRIL 7, 1969

Meeting was convened by Chairman Wilson

SB-312 - Decreases Nevada state hospital revolving fund and
provides for disposal of patients clothing

Mr. Wahrenbrock stated that this was a major problem in the hospital and difficult to store this equipment if there is an indigent patient. If they have a family available, they would take their personal belongings.

Frazzini moved to postpone action on SB-312 for further information from Dr. McAllister (Wednesday).

Swallow seconded.

Motion carried.

SB-339 - Repeals requirement that physician report certain information concerning epileptics to health division

Wahrenbrock: The doctors are not doing this and there is no enforcement to get the doctors to report the cases. The Health Division has asked for repeal. Dr. Carr of the Health Division to clarify this bill.

SB-346 - Authorizes savings account for Nevada state childrens' home

It was questioned by the committee what the money was to be used for, whether it was for the benefit of individual children or the state children's home.

Wahrenbrock: This would be money that the children would earn from part-time jobs, money from gifts, money from relatives and friends. John Aberasturi will clarify this bill (Wednesday).

Foote moved to defer action on SB-346 and SB-339 until further information is obtained.

May seconded.

Motion carried.

SB-350 - Require health division to review district swimming pool program

Mr. Wahrenbrock pointed out that SB-490 was similar and recommended that the committee might want to postpone action until SB-490 was available to them.

May moved to postpone action until they get SB-490; Frazzini seconded; motion carried.

SB-298 - Restricts exemption of cosmetologists from licensing as barbers

May suggested an amendment on line 14 to change "mens'" to the "hair of males". He stated that this had been agreed to by both barbers and cosmetologists.

Swallow moved a do pass as amendmended; Homer seconded; motion carried.
