MINUTES OF MEETING - COMMITTEE ON LABOR AND MANAGEMENT - ASSEMBLY
55TH SESSION, FEBRUARY 5, 1969

Present: Capurro, Lingenfelter, Webb, Wilson, Branch and Mello
Absent: May.

Chairman Capurro opened the meeting for discussion of AB 73, 74, 75, and 76 all of which involve the Nevada Industrial Commission.

One committee member, Assemblyman Wilson, is identified in the sponsorship of each of these bills along with others. Mr. Wilson said that these bills should be given a committee hearing. Assemblyman Mello indicated that there are also a group of related bills coming from the Senate.

Chairman Capurro said that the Association of General Contractors has asked to be heard on them and asked the committee for suggestions of other interested parties. Mr. Paley, Executive Secretary of the AFL-CIO, was suggested along with Chairman T. L. Hutchings, Nevada Industrial Commission.

Assemblyman Lingenfelter moved that AB 73, 74, 75 and 76 be held for hearing and further consideration along with the bills expected from the Senate.

Mello seconded.

Motion unanimously passed.

Chairman Capurro said the committee's attention also would have to directed to AB-5 and AB-96. Mr. Theodore Stokes has sent a letter to the committee asking to be heard on AB-96. Assemblyman Lingenfelter stated that Mr. Carl Bogart also should be heard and he told the Chairman that he would furnish the names of others together with some material he had received on the legislation.

The committee agreed to set a hearing on AB 96 for Thursday, February 13.

Chairman Capurro then informed the members that he had received a report from the State of Oregon together with a special report from the Hartford Insurance Group relative to improvements on the workmens compensation laws. He said that he would appoint a sub-committee to study these and report back their feelings on recommended changes. Appointed to the sub-committee were May, Lingenfelter and Wilson.

Chairman Capurro said that that was all that was pending at this time and stated he would set the hearing on AB-96 for next Thursday as agreed and would contact the persons interested.

Meeting adjourned.
