UTAH LAW - THEFT OR EMBEZZLEMENT

For the week in which he has been discharged from his most recent work for theft or embezzlement connected with such work as shown by the facts together with his admission, or as shown by his conviction in a court of competent jurisdiction, and for the 51 next following weeks, provided that when by reason of the alleged theft or embezzlement in connection with his work such individual is held in legal custody or is free on bail, any determination of his eligibility shall be held in abeyance pending his release or conviction.

ADAPTED FROM ILLINOIS LAW - THEFT OR EMBEZZLEMENT

An individual shall be disqualified for benefits for \_\_\_\_\_ weeks occurring within the current or following benefit year beginning with the week in which he was discharged by his most recent employing unit for theft or embezzlement connected with his work, and no benefit rights shall accrue to such individual based upon wages from such employing unit for service rendered prior to the day upon which such individual was discharged; provided that this disqualification shall not apply unless the individual has admitted his commission of the theft or embezzlement to a representative of the Executive Director, or has signed a written admission of such act and such admission has been presented to the Executive Director or his representative, or such act has resulted in a conviction by a court of competent jurisdiction; and provided further, that if by reason of such act, he is in legal custody, held on bail or is a fugitive from justice, the determination of his benefit rights shall be held in abeyance pending the result of any legal proceedings arising therefrom.
