MINUTES OF TRANSPORTATION MEETING HELD WEDNESDAY, MARCH 19TH, 1969 - 8:00 A.M.

Chairman Hafen convened the meeting at 8:15 a.m. for the purpose of further revising AB 271.

Grant Davis presented a copy of AB 267 amended as he had been directed at a previous meeting.

Discussion started on Section 80, which states that the provisions of this chapter shall not apply to persons, teams, motor vehicles and other equipment while actually engaged in work upon the surface of the highway but shall apply while traveling to and from work except where specified.

Davis mentioned that it should be amended to Section 94 of this bill, suggesting that section 94 should be inserted into 80 where it defines drugs, and not just intoxicated.

Mr. Ashworth so moved.
Motion seconded.
Motion carried.

Subsequent sections were discussed briefly and no suggestions as to changes were made.

Quite a bit of discussion occurred on Section 89 which relates to local garages or repair shops where vehicles are brought in which have evidence of having been involved in an accident must report to the police this vehicle.

Mr. Quinn commented that there might be some objections to this from garage owners.

Tom Cook said that they had some objection to this, that he thought that the police officers that investigate the accident should have stickers and place it on the car at the time and that this would relieve the garage owners from the responsibility.

Grant Davis said that this was the language of the uniform code as presently stated in Section 89.

Mr. Glaser suggested that Mr. Davis prepare some amendments to Section 89 and submit them.

Section 94 was discussed next

Discussion reverted to AB 263 and Mr. Davis said in order to be uniform the language that is used in Section 94 defining narcotics should be inserted.

Mr. Ashworth moved to amend AB 263 to include the language in Section 94 where it defines narcotics.

Motion seconded.

Motion carried.

Further discussion on Section 94 revealed that changes should be made.

Mr. Ashworth moved "or" be used instead of and in paragraph 4, line 19 and that line 17 should be changed from 10 years to 3 years.

Motion seconded.

Motion carried.

Section 95 was approved as is.

Section 96 approved as is.

Before discussion could be finished on Section 97 the meeting was adjourned as the Assembly had convened. It was agreed by Committee to meet at 10:30 March 20th in the Speaker's office.
