MARCH 10, 1969

The meeting was called to order by Chairman R. Young at 10:40 A.M. in the Ways and Means Room.

Mr. Bill Hancock, Mr. Fitz, Mr. Flangas, President Edd Miller, Chancellor Humphrey, Mr. Frank Dayken, Dr. Zorn, Mr. Gene Empey were present to discuss A.B. 149.

A.B. 149 is an act relating to the acquisition of public buildings; creating the Nevada building authority; providing for the issuance of bonds and other securities; making an appropriation; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Mr. Jacobsen asked how much would be recommended for the pilot project. Mr. Dayken stated that it would be \$100,000 for the athletic field.

Representatives of the State Planning Board and the University of Nevada System spoke in favor of A.B. 149, but felt it should be amended to state that the Planning Board be ex officio the building authority and that it be clearly stated that each and every new project would have to be approved by the legislature.

Chairman Young read a memorandum from Mr. Howard Barrett asking Committee members to review the State Health Officers Salary, as they are currently recruiting to fill the position. Certain recommendation were made.

A bill which creates the Las Vegas Convention Authority Stadium and Sports Center Construction Assistance Fund account in the State Treasury; making an appropriation thereto; imposing duties on State officers and agencies; and providing other matters properly relating thereto was read by Chairman Young.

Mr. Ashworth moved that this bill be introduced by the Ways and Means Committee.
Mr. Bowler seconded the motion.

Mr. Wilson McGowan and Mr. Rudy Moreno were present to discuss the State Controller's Office Budget.

Mr. McGowan stated that four new positions are recommended. Senior Accountant, Principal Clerk Typist, Senior Account Clerk and Account Clerk.

Mr. Glaser asked why Printing-Operational was increased to \$8,000.

Mr. Moreno stated that this was for Data Processing forms, and buying checks, etc.

Mr. Glaser wondered what Contract Services was for. Mr. Moreno said this was the conversion from Model 20 computer to Model 40.

Mr. Joe Miner was present to discuss Predatory Animal and RodentttControl .

Mr. Miner stated that most of the Supervision and related costs are from the Federal Budget, approximately \$145,000 for this program. Part of the field program is also financed by this Federal Budget and part by a Woolgrowers Predatory Animal Committee Budget of approximately \$40,000.

Mr. Miner commented that there are headquarters in Reno, Elko, and Ely.

Mr. Jacobsen asked what were the primary predatory animals.

Mr. Miner said the Cyote, Mountain Lyon, and Bobcat, Rodent: Blacktail Jack Rabbit, Meadow Mouse, Gopher, and Ground Squirrel.

The major Budget change is in funding. The Nevada Fish and Game Commission requests their expenditure be reduced to \$20,000 per year. A corresponding \$20,000 increase in appropriated funds is recommended to continue the program at the same level.

Other increases include \$2,000 in equipment for the purchase of two small camp trailers each year. These units will soon pay for themselves in reduced mileage and lodging expense of field personnel.

- 1. From information obtained August 26, 1968 from the Division of Buildings and Grounds, the following approximate annual rent is paid for non-state owned apace in Carson City, Las Vegas and Reno.
 - a. Carson City \$ 51,603.00/yr for 19,090 nsf b. Las Vegas - \$153,930.00/yr for 49,678 nsf \$ 94,092.00/yr for 54,078 nsf c. Reno -\$299,625.00 for 122,846 nsf Total
- 2. If computed at 6% for 20 years the above noted annual rents could amortize the following bond issues:
 - a. Carson City \$ 591,000.00 \$1,765,220.00 b. Las Vegas c. Reno -\$1,079,235.00
- 3. Discounting design costs, land costs, parking and landscaping and using a building cost of 30.00/gsf, these bond issues could result in the construction of the following noted square footage.
 - a. Carson City 19,700 gsf or space for 78 employees b. Las Vegas - 58,840 gsf or space for 235 employees 35,974 gsf or space for 143 employees
- 4. The following are current estimates of administrative space (state owned) deficiencies for general fund executive branch agencies in the 3 areas. It is computed to consider current overcrowding and a growth factor of 3% per year.
