MINUTES OF MEETING - WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE - NEVADA STATE LEGISLATURE

MARCH 27, 1969

55th SESSION

The meeting was called to order by Chairman R. Young at 3:30 P.M. in the Ways and Means Room.

Mr. Reese Taylor, Chairman, Mr. Gene Milligan, Secretary, Mr. Evo Granata, and Mr. Noel Clark were present to discuss the <u>Public Service Commission and Taxicab Regulation</u>.

Mr. Taylor stated that there are presently 27 persons working for the Public Service Commission. Twelve new positions are requested. An additional Mechanical Engineer is requested to be placed in Las Vegas where he will handle gas and water utility cases and problems. The addition of an Electrical Engineer will carry out the mulititude of regulatory responsibilities connected with telephone and telegraph companies, paying services, and community antenna television companies. A Utility Tariff Clerk has been requested to handle the many revisions in traiff filings presented to the Commission daily. Four additional Field Investigators and one Senior Field Investigator are requested. A senior Accountant is requested in the first year of the biennium. A Principal Auditor is requested in the seconded year to allow for increased auditing activities. A senior Clerk-Stenographer, and Senior Legal Stenographer are to add support to the increase staff. One full time Legal Counsel is requested.

Presently the mill tax is at a rate of 2 mills. The Commission is proposing to raise this rate to 2.75 mills which will provide them with sufficient monies for the recommended increase in regulatory funds.

Mr. Taylor commented on $\underline{A.B.723}$ which limits definition of public utilities and raises tax rate on intrastate revenues of public utilities, and $\underline{A.B.732}$ Increases certain motor vehicle carrier license fees.

Mr. Taylor referred to the Personnel Supplement which states that the Branch Manager in Las Vegas is an Unclassified position. Mr. Taylor felt this position should either be a Classified position or should have an extensive increase in salary.

Taxicab Regulation

Included in salaries is 5% of the Commissioners' salaries and 50% of one of the Public Service Commission's staff auditors. The Commission estimates that this is the amount of time the Commissioners and auditor will spend on taxicab regulations.

Mr. Taylor discussed S.B. 155 which establishes regulations for taxicabs.

Mr. Taylor stated that the Budget is \$15,000 short. <u>A.B. 731</u> which amends registration and license fee schedules for certain motor carriers would cause the Commission to lose this revenue.

The Governor recommends 6 new positions, Administrative Services Administrator, Senior Clerk Stenographer, and six Senior Field Investigators. Agency requests 10 new positions, \$13,000 is requested for the Taxicab Commissioner.

Mr. Taylor read a letter from Mr. Dave Henry regarding the Taxicab problem.

Mr. Taylor stated that Mr. Ashworth, Mr. Bowler, Mr. May and Mr. Espinoza indicated that a presentation be made to the Ways and Means Committee on the situation in Clark County regarding the Central Telephone Company.

Mr. F. Young suggested that an appropriation be made for making an extensive study of billing practives and procedures. A Commission should also be made to analyze and make a report to the Committee.

Mr. Milligan said he contacted Stone and Webster in California and they would make an investigation for approximately \$35,000. Operating equipment, financing, traffic problems, etc. would be investigated, but this would not include depreciation, and services. There is no reference to this investigation in the Budget.

Mr. F. Young commented that it is a frustrating experience to use the telephone in Southern Nevada. He suggested a good engineering study be made as to what should be done.

A.B. 629 Authorizes Board of Regents, University of Nevada to issue revenue bonds for construction of college of education building, University of Nevada, Las Vegas.

Mr. F. Young moved that $\underline{A.B.}$ 629 be reported out with a DO PASS. Mr. Close seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

A.B. 630 Authorizes Board of Regents, University of Nevada to issue revenue bonds for phase II construction of chemistry and lecture demonstration buildings of physical science building project and construction of college of education building, both at University of Nevada, Reno.

Mr. Webb moved that $\underline{A.B.}$ 630 be reported out with a DO PASS. Mr. Close seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

A.B. 631 Amends 1967 act authorizing sale of University securities for construction of chemistry and lecture buildings of physical science building project, phase I University of Nevada, Reno, by redefining "pledge revenues".

Mr. Webb moved that $\underline{A.B.}$ 631 be reported out with a DO PASS. Mr. Close seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

A.B. 700 Authorizes project by Nevada Building authority.

Mr. Close moved that $\underline{A.B.}$ 700 be reported out with a DO PASS. Mr. Ashworth seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

S.B. 191 Increases Vehicle Registration Fee for Benefit of Nevada Highway Patrol.

Mr. Close moved that $\underline{\text{S.B. }191}$ be reported out with a DO PASS. Mr. Glaser seconded the motion. Motion lost.
