

MARCH 28, 1969

55th SESSION

The meeting was called to order by Chairman R. Young at 11:17 A.M. in the Ways and Means Room.

Present: R. Young, Howard, Bowler, Webb, F. Young, Jacobsen, Close, Glaser

Absent: Ashworth

Mrs. Frazzini and Mrs. DeCosta, Chairman spoke on A.B. 376, which creates Nevada Commission on the status of women.

An allocation was provided in the Budget for \$4,250 for two years. Many other states are statutory and funded in this area. Alaska receives \$5,000 a year, and California receives \$35,000.

Mr. Jacobsen asked if all the Counties were represented. Mrs. DeCosta stated that they were.

Funds are raised from luncheons, donations, etc. A net of \$700 from the luncheon at the Governor's Mansion, \$170 in Las Vegas, \$325 from the Nevada Federation, \$25 from the Reno Association of Legal Secretaries.

Mrs. Rosemary Clark spoke on A.B. 470 which improves Mental Health Services Program. Estimate cost: \$150,000 per year.

Mrs. Clark stated that this bill is not only for Clark County, but for any community throughout the State.

After further discussion Mr. Close moved to re-consider the bill.

Mr. F. Young seconded the motion.

With six members voting aye, the motion passed.

Mr. Close suggested we discuss the bill further.

Mr. Howard moved that A.B. 376 be held for further study.

Mr. Close seconded the motion.

Motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Howard moved that A.B. 411 be postponed indefinitely.

Mr. Bowler seconded the motion.

Motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Close discussed a bill which changes requirements for annual reports of state agencies to biennial reports.

Mr. Bowler moved that this bill be introduced by the Ways and Means Committee.

Mr. Howard seconded the motion.

Motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Close discussed A.B. 683 which provides compensation for victims of crime.

Mr. F. Young moved that A.B. 683 be reported out with a DO PASS as amended.

Mr. Close seconded the motion.

Motion passed unanimously.

S.B. 300 Provides for community training center for retarded persons.

Mr. Frank Young moved that S.B. 300 be reported out with a DO PASS.

Mr. Close seconded the motion.

Motion passed unanimously.

S.B. 333 Abolishes state Economic Development and publicity fund.

Mr. Close moved that S.B. 333 be reported out with a DO PASS.

Mr. Jacobsen seconded the motion.

Motion passed unanimously.

S.B. 334 Amends statutes relating to state financial administration to conform to present practices.

Mr. Jacobsen moved that S.B. 334 be reported out with a DO PASS.

Mr. Bowler seconded the motion.

Motion passed unanimously.

A.B. 140 Provides for Central depository for distribution of state publications. Estimate of cost: \$11,500 per year.

Mr. Frank Young moved that A.B. 140 be reported out with a DO PASS.

Mr. Glaser seconded the motion.

Motion passed unanimously.
