Minutes of Meeting - March 4, 1971

PRESENT: Chairman, D. Poggione, R. Capurro, H. McKissick, T. Hafen D. Branch, R. Bryan and D. Mello.

GUESTS: Lee H. Burnham, Acting Deputy Director, Dept. of Employment Security; G.A. Fletcher, Administrator, Unemployment Compensation Service Division and Louis Paley, Executive Secretary, AFL-CIO.

Meeting was called to order by Chairman, Dan Poggione at 8:55 a.m. in Room 320, to consider <u>S.B. 218</u>.

S.B. 218 Provides extended unemployment compensation benefits.

Mr. Fletcher, Administrator of the Unemployment Compensation Division, told of the necessity of approval of this bill immediately so that requirements of the Federal Law could be met in regard to beginning the first 13 weeks extension by March 21st. The costs would be approximately \$365,000,00 for the balance of the year with the Federal Government paying 50%.

Dependents, who were being paid on the original claim would continue to receive benefits amounting to half of the original amount paid. They would have to meet the same requirements as that on the original claim.

Mr. Fletcher also stated that the last figures showed 1,947 people eligible for these added benefits but he estimated that 500 more per month are being added. The last 13 week period showed a 5.4% rate of unemployment which is 1.4 higher than the average of the last two years. The fact that newcomers to the State could not qualify under our laws for this 13 week extension, since their original claim had not been filed in Nevada, was also brought out.

The money to be spent on this extension of unemployment benefits would come out of the trust fund, which at present stands at \$37,000,000. Mr. Paley stated that it was the employers' money that would be spent that is in this trust fund and the employers have agreed to go for the extended benefit. The unions also support this legislation.

Motion was made by Dave Branch, seconded by D. Mello, for an emergency "Do pass". Motion carried unanimously, except for R. Bryan, who abstained from voting since he had not read the bill.

Meeting adjourned at 9:10 a.m.
