The meeting was called to order by the Chairman.

Assemblyman Ullom moved that <u>SB 312</u> be given a "DOPASS". Assemblyman Smith seconded _____ The motion carried unanimously.

Assemblyman Ullom moved that AB 843 be given a "DO PASS". Assemblyman Getto seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

AB 8, which concerns the new North Las Vegas charter was discussed and it was felt by the committee that people who do not live within the city and do not pay city taxes should not have the benefits of the city. Mr. Warren told the committee that any action taken by the committee with regard to fixing of water rates in the city charter would effect the other cities in the the motion.

Assemblyman May moved that AB 8 be given a "DO PASS".

Assemblyman Young seconded the motion.

The motion carried.

Assemblyman Brookman did not vote.

AB 7/22 - Extends permissible duration of local government contracts for professional services.

Mr. Morgan told the committee that this was permissive legislation to allow counties to contract with teachers for a two year period if they desired, some counties are presently doing so.

Assemblyman May moved "DO PASS".
Assemblyman Ullom seconded the motion.
The motion carried.

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AB 766 - Amends provisions of Local Government Employee-Managment Relation Act.

This bill would prevent the problem the school districts presently have in regard to the date of settling contracts. It would provide for a per-centage amount of the money received by the school district instead of the dollar amount, which is unknown in legislative years.

AB 506 - Changes composition of Public Employees' Retirement Board and provides for electing members.

Mr. Morgan explained to the committee that the most logical number of employees to be elected to the group was 5. He suggested that the bill allow this process to be gradual and as the terms of members expire, the members will be elected to replace them. Mr. Warren suggested more employer representation on the board.

Assemblyman Young moved that AB 786 be "INDEFINITELY POSTPONED". Assemblyman Ford seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

Assemblyman Ullom moved that AB 853 be "INDEFINITELY POSTPONED". Assemblyman Brookman seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

Assemblyman Young moved that <u>AB 880</u> be re-referred to Taxation. Assemblyman Getto seconded the motion. The motion carried. Assemblyman Gojack voted No.

Assemblyman Getto moved that <u>AB 904</u> be given a "DO PASS AND RE-REFER TO WAYS AND MEANS" recommendation. The motion was seconded by Assemblyman Brookman. The motion carried. Assemblyman Young voted NO.

Assemblyman Getto moved that AB 905 be "INDEFINITELY POSTPONED". Assemblyman Ford seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

Assemblyman Gojack moved that $\underline{AB\ 915}$ be given a "DO PASS". Assemblyman Ford seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

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Assemblyman Ford moved that AB 657 be "INDEFINITELY POSTPONED". assemblyman Getto seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

Chairman Dini appointed a sub-committee of Assemblyman Gojack and himself to amend AB 239.

Assemblyman May moved that <u>AB 647</u> be "INDEFINITELY POSTPONED". Assemblyman Young seconded the motion. The motion carried. Assemblyman Ford did not vote.

Assemblyman Ford moved "DO PASS" on SJR 7 of the 56th. Assemblyman Brookman seconded the motion. Assemblyman Dini, Getto and Ullom voted No. The motion carried. Assemblyman Ullom changed his vote.

Assemblyman Ullom moved to "INDEFINITELY POSTPONE" AB 312. Assemblyman Ford seconded the motion.

The motion carried.

Assemblyman May voted NO.

Assemblyman Ullom moved to "DO PASS" AB 38.* Assemblyman May seconded the motion. The motion carried.
