## DATES OF THE STATE OF THE STATE ADDRESS DELIVERED TO THE NEVADA LEGISLATURE

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The “State of the State Address” or “State of the State Speech” is required by Article 5, Section 10, of the *Constitution of the State of Nevada*. It reads:

Governor’s message. He shall communicate by Message to the Legislature at every regular Session the condition of the State and recommend such measures as he may deem expedient[.]

This fact sheet provides brief information on the session, date, and conveyor of each State of the State Address delivered to the Nevada Legislature during or preceding a regular legislative session, or to the people of the State of Nevada at select other times, since the first State of the State Address to the most recent.
