FOREWORD

The Nevada Legislative Counsel Bureau is a fact-finding organization designed to assist legislators, state officers, and citizens in obtaining the facts concerning the government of the State, proposed legislation, and matters vital to the welfare of the people. This office will always tenonpartisan and nonpolitical; it will not deal in propaganda, take part in any political campaign, nor endorse or oppose any candidate for public office.

The primary purpose of the Bureau is to assist citizens and officials in obtaining effective state government at a reasonable cost. The plan is to search out facts about government and to render unbiased interpretations of them. Its aim is to cooperate with public officials, and to be helpful rather than critical. Your suggestions, comments, and criticisms will greatly aid in accomplishing the object for which we are all working - the promotion of the welfare of the State of Nevada.



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The tabulations on the following pages have been compiled for ready reference in connection with appropriations made by the 1951 Session of the Nevada Legislature.

Schedule 1 shows the amounts appropriated and the funds from which such appropriations were made.

Schedule 2 shows the amounts appropriated and the period to which such appropriations are applicable. The amounts shown under the column headed "For Biennium 1951 - 1953" represent appropriations which could not be classified into any of the three remaining categories shown on this schedule. This column contains some appropriations, the statutes covering which provide reversion dates prior to June 30, 1953, or provide no reversion date, as shown in the last column of this schedule. The column headed "For Biennium 1951 - 1953" also includes two appropriations, the effective dates of which are prior to July 1, 1951.

These two appropriations are noted on the schedule. The amounts shown in this column should not, however, be construed to indicate normal governmental operating expenses for the biennium.

Schedule 3 is self-explanatory.

The usual "repealer" section of the General Appropriation Bill (Chap. 279, Sec. 62) is effective in one instance. Chap. 210, 1951 Statutes appropriates \$5,500.00 to the office of the Attorney General for bill drafting, and Sec. 5 of Chap. 279, 1951 Statutes, provides a like amount for the same purpose.

Chap. 285, 1951 Statutes, commonly called the "Ex-officio Salary
Bill" provides "added" and "ex officio" salaries for certain state

officers. With the exception of those listed below, all salaries mentioned in this Chapter have been included (under the salary provision section) in the appropriations for the respective offices and departments in the General Appropriation Act (Chapter 279). The salaries not thus included are:

Therefore, the sum of \$4,200.00 is shown on the accompanying schedules as appropriated by Chapter 285, Sec. 8.

Attention is called to Sec. 1 of the chapter referred to in the preceding paragraph, with reference to "added" salary of the State Printer. Strict adherence to the statute dictates that this amount be paid from the General Fund. However, the bill creating the State Printing Fund (Chapter 212, 1951 Statutes) specifically states that the State Printer's salary shall be paid therefrom. The intent of the Legislature is clear and the fact that Chapter 285 directs that the "added" salary of the State Printer is to be paid from the General Fund is an oversight in bill drafting, and the provisions of Chapter 212 as to the payment of the State Printer's salary should prevail.

In the preparation of this analysis, we have been confronted with a situation in which the terminology "Revolving Fund" and its use must be clarified. Generally speaking, in the past, funds have

been designated as Revolving Funds when in truth such funds should not fall under that classification. In order to be consistent in the use of fund designation, this office will be guided by the following definitions of various classifications of funds:

REVOLVING FUND -- A fund provided to carry out a cycle of operations. The amounts expended from the fund are restored thereto from earnings from operations or by transfers from other funds, so that it is always intact, either in the form of cash, receivables or other assets.

WORKING CAPITAL FUND -- A fund established to finance activities, generally of a service nature, such as a purchase and stores department, printing department, etc. It is distinguished from a revolving fund in that the working capital fund is not, from its very nature, required to be kept intact. It may be increased over the original appropriation thereto by profits accruing from the activities of the department, and may be decreased due to losses incurred. It is analogous to a revolving fund only in that the working capital fund may be composed of receivables, inventories, etc., in addition to cash.

SPECIAL PURPOSE FUND -- A fund provided to finance a specific activity or for consummation of a specific function. If any balance remains after the activity is terminated or the function completed, such balance may or may not revert to the general fund, depending on the provisions of the statute creating the fund. If a balance remains and no provision is made in the statute for reversion, legislative action would be required for the balance to be reverted to the general fund.
