INTERIM ASSESSMENTS: FORMATIVE TESTS THAT GUIDE INSTRUCTION

- GRADES K 10
- MATHEMATICS, READING, ENGLISH, AND SCIENCE (MS)
- ADMINISTERED THREE TIMES PER YEAR
- USED TO ASSESS BENCHMARKED STANDARDS FOR THAT TRIMESTER OR QUARTER
- RESULTS LOADED INTO IDMS AND REPORTS E-MAILED TO ADMINISTRATORS AND TEACHERS TWO TO THREE DAYS FROM WHEN ANSWER DOCUMENTS ARE SCANNED INTO IDMS

- ASSISTS K-12 EDUCATORS IN CREATING/ADMINISTERING/AND ANALYZING ASSESSMENTS TO GUIDE INSTRUCTION
- PROVIDES DATA FOR STRUCTURED TEACHER PLANNING TIME
- ◆PRODUCES REPORTS FOR PARENT-STUDENT-TEACHER ACADEMIC PLANNING TIME (PSTAPT) CONFERENCING
- *ALLOWS TEACHERS TO PREPARE AND KNOW STUDENT STRENGTHS AND WEAKNESSES AT THE BEGINNING OF THE SCHOOL YEAR

ALIGNMENT OF INTERIM ASSESSMENTS WITH THE STATE CRITERION-REFERENCED TESTS

CORRELATION BETWEEN CRT and INTERIM ASSESSMENT SCORES:

Reading: .764 overall in grades 3-8 (N=145,953)

Math: .783 overall in grades 3-8 (N=145,953)

Science: .817 overall in grade 8 (N=24,593)

RESULTS INDICATE A STRONG, POSITIVE CORRELATION EXISTS
BETWEEN INTERIM ASSESSMENTS AND THE CRT'S

DATA REPORTING

REPORTS PROVIDED TO ALL SCHOOLS

- ITEM ANALYSIS: lists items and the high/low percentage of students answering correctly
- CLASS SUMMARY: displays overall individual and class performance on standards
- TOTAL TEST/RANKED STUDENT LIST: assists teachers in grouping students for differentiated instruction
- STUDENT REPORT: displays individual student strengths/weaknesses (used in PSTAPT conferences)

PROS

- LEVELS THE PLAYING FIELD
- ALLOWS TRANSFERS ACROSS STATES WITHOUT LOSS OF ACADEMIC CONTINUITY
- TEXTBOOK COST COULD GO DOWN AS PUBLISHERS COULD FOCUS ON ONE GROUP OF STANDARDS
- LIKE ASSESSMENTS GIVEN ACROSS STATES ALLOW FOR MORE EQUALIZED COMPARISON

TESTING CALENDAR

- LENGTHEN THE REPORTING CALENDAR BY ONE MONTH, ALLOW ING SCHOOLS TO TEST AT APPROXIMATELY 150 DAYS INSTEAD OF THE CURRENT 120 DAYS
- ALLÓW SCHOOLS, DISTRICT, AND STATE TO REPORT AYP RESULTS IN SEPTEMBER
