## NOTICE OF INTENT TO ACT UPON A REGULATION

Notice of Hearing for the adoption of Regulations of the Nevada Division of Agriculture

The Nevada Division of Agriculture will hold a public hearing at 9:00 a.m. on January 23, 1998 at 350 Capitol Hill Ave., Reno, NV. The purpose of the hearing is to receive comments from all interested persons regarding the amendment of regulations that pertain to chapter 554 of the Nevada Administrative Code pertaining to Quarantine Violations and Fines. The following information is provided pursuant to the requirements of NRS 233B.060:

## Need for and purpose of the proposed regulation or amendment:

NRS 554 was amended in the last legislative session providing for administrative fines for violations of provisions governing interstate quarantines. The amendment mandated that the state quarantine officer adopt regulations specifying a schedule fines which may be imposed upon notice and hearing. The administrative fines provide a deterrent to violations which have the potential to cause severe economic effects in Nevada.

# Economic effect of these proposed amendments on the businesses which it is to regulate:

#### a. Adverse effects:

There are adverse effects on business which do not comply with the requirements of interstate quarantines. Violators of these quarantine would be subject to the fines after notice and hearing.

## b. Beneficial effects:

Those businesses that comply with the quarantine provisions will benefit from the reduced risk of economic loss provided by the deterrent to violations.

c. Immediate and long term economic effects:

The adverse and beneficial effects are the same for immediate and long term.

## Economic effect of these proposed amendments on the public:

## a. Adverse effects:

There are no adverse effects on the public.

## b. Beneficial effects:

The public will benefit from the reduced risk of economic loss provided by the deterrent to violations and the reduction of the risk of severe economic loss to the State of Nevada.

c. Immediate and long term economic effects:

The adverse and beneficial effects are the same for immediate and long term.

Economic cost to the agency for enforcement of the proposed amendments:

There are no additional costs to the agency for enforcement of these amendments.

Description of any regulations of other state, local or federal governmental agencies which the proposed amendments overlap or duplicate:

There are no other state, local or federal governmental regulations that the proposed amendments overlap or duplicate.

Fees: These amendments do not create any new fees or increase any existing fees.

Persons wishing to comment upon the proposed action of the Nevada Division of Agriculture may appear at the scheduled public hearing or may address their comments, data, views, or arguments, in written form, to the Nevada Division of Agriculture, 350 Capitol Hill Ave., Reno, NV. Written submissions must be received by the Nevada Division of Agriculture, 350 Capitol Hill Ave., Reno, NV on or before January 22, 1998. If no person who is directly affected by the proposed action appears to request time to make an oral presentation, the Nevada Division of Agriculture, 350 Capitol Hill Ave., Reno, NV may proceed immediately to act upon any written submissions.

the consideration urged against its adoption.

# PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO NAC 554 QUARANTINE VIOLATIONS AND FINES

Authority: NRS 554

Chapter NAC 554 is hereby amended by adding thereto the provisions set forth as Section 1 through Section 4:

- Section 1. "Notice of Violation" means a nursery inspection report or interview notice completed by a division of agriculture representative stating the statute or rule violated, the disposition of the nursery stock found in violation, and signed by the division of agriculture representative and the representative of the business where the violation occurred.
- Sec. 2. "Notice of Warning" means a written statement issued by the division of agriculture stating the statute or rule violated and directing any corrective action that must be completed by the violator.
- Sec. 3. A notice of warning may be issued to the violator for the first violation that was unintentional and did not pose a threat of introduction of a quarantined insect, weed or plant disease due to the fact that the unlawful importation of the nursery stock did not contain any quarantined pest. No fine will be assessed in addition to the notice of warning.
- Sec. 4. In addition to any other penalty, the administrator may assess a fine against a person according to the following schedule:
- 1. NRS 554.060(1&2) Destruction or treatment. Failure to comply with destruction of any nursery stock or treatment of any nursery stock within the time limits listed on the notice of violation:
  - a. 1st violation \$1,500.00
  - b. 2nd violation \$3,000.00
  - c. 3rd and subsequent violations \$5,000.00
  - 2. NRS 554.070 Unlawful importation of or in-state transportation of nursery stock:
    - a. 1st violation \$1,500.00
    - b. 2nd violation \$3,000.00

c. 3rd and subsequent violations - \$5,000.00
