## PROPOSED REGULATIONS OF THE NEVADA STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION STATE BOARD FOR OCCUPATIONAL EDUCATION

The Nevada State Board of Education/Nevada State Board for Occupational Education intends to hold a public hearing on the proposed regulations on May 21 or 22, 1998.

Requirements for Promotion Between Middle School and High School
Statutory Authority: NRS
389.aaa Courses required for promotion from middle or junior high school to high school. Commencing with the 1999-2000 school year, to be promoted from middle or junior high school to high school, a pupil must earn a passing grade in the minimum required courses during the 7th and 8th grades in accordance with the following table:
Minimum Required Courses Passed
English/Language Arts 1 Mathematics 1
389.bbb Courses required for promotion from middle or junior high school to high school. Commencing with the 2000-2001 school year, to be promoted from middle or junior high school to high school, a pupil must earn a passing grade in the minimum required courses during the 7th and 8th grades in accordance with the following table:
Minimum Required Courses Passed
English/Language Arts 1.5  Mathematics 1.5
<b>389.ccc</b> Courses applicable toward promotion. Courses which a pupil may apply toward promotion from middle or junior high school to high school may be completed:
1. In a public or private middle or junior high school located in this state.

- 2. In a public or private middle or junior high school located outside this state if the school district approves a transfer of the units for this purpose.
- 3. In the Nevada youth training center or the Nevada girls training center.
- <u>389.ddd</u> Credit for sectarian religious courses not allowed. Credit for sectarian religious courses may not be applied to fulfill requirements for promotion from junior high or middle school to high school.

**389.eee** Summer school courses applicable toward graduation.

- 1. Summer school courses to be applied toward promotion from junior high or middle school to high school may consist only of courses passed during a summer school program conducted by a public or private junior high or middle school.
- 2. Such courses passed must be equivalent to the courses offered in the programs of the junior high or middle school in which the student is enrolled.

389.fff Requirements for promotion from middle or junior high school to high school for pupils transferring to Nevada high school.

1. A pupil who transfers to a Nevada middle or junior high school from another school, whether located inside or outside this state, shall have their coursework evaluated according to procedures adopted by the board of trustees of the receiving school district.

389.ggg Promotion for pupils with disabilities. Any pupil with disabilities who meets that standards prescribed by his individualized education plan may be promoted from junior high or middle school to high school.
