OF MOTOR VEHICLES**

AUTHORITY: §1, NRS 482.160 and 482.3667.

Section 1. NAC 482.350 is hereby amended to read as follows:

482.350 The department will notify, by mail, a person who has applied for personalized prestige license plates when the license plates are available to be picked up. The applicant has a period of 60 calendar days after the date on which this notification is sent to pick up the license plates from the department. If the applicant fails to pick up the license plates within the 60-day period, the department will ~~notify the applicant by certified mail, return receipt requested, that it will~~ destroy the license plates . ~~after 15 days have elapsed from the date on which the certified notification was sent.]~~

INFORMATIONAL STATEMENT

The following statement is submitted for adopted amendments to Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) 482 related to Special Order License Plate Certified Letters.

The Department of Motor Vehicles noticed public regulation workshop and hearings by posting workshop and hearing notices in all Department offices and in counties where a Department office is not located in the County Public Library. Neither verbal or written comments were received.

No one attended hearings in either Reno or Las Vegas.

Comments were solicited from affected persons by notices posted in Department offices and county libraries as outlined in paragraph two.

The permanent regulation was adopted without change to any part of the proposed regulation, since there was no public comment.

There is no immediate or long term economic effect of the adopted regulation.

There will not be any additional cost to the agency to enforcement this regulation.

There are no other state or government agency regulations that the proposed regulation will duplicate.
