

**LCB File No. R139-03**

**PROPOSED REGULATION OF THE STATE BOARD  
OF ARCHITECTURE, INTERIOR DESIGN  
AND RESIDENTIAL DESIGN**

**Chapter 623 of NAC is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:**

*NAC 623.\_\_\_\_ Credit for interior design education or training. This table applies to applicants who have not obtained an interior design degree that has been accredited by the Foundation for Interior Design Education Research (FIDER). An applicant for interior design registration must have at least six years of education and training, a minimum of two years must be in education; and a minimum of two years must be in training.*
