**PROPOSED REGULATION OF THE STATE  
BOARD OF ORIENTAL MEDICINE**

*NAC 634A.012 Approval of schools of oriental medicine (NRS 634A.090)*

*An applicant for approval of an institution to offer Oriental medicine must complete the application process of the Nevada Commission on Postsecondary Education and;*

- 1. Submit to the Commission evidence of a doctorate-level degree in Oriental medicine from an accredited institution as defined by NRS 394.006; and*
- 2. Submit to the State Board of Oriental Medicine the application fee of \$5000.*

*NAC 634A.014 Course of the study for the degree of doctor of Oriental medicine (NRS 634A.090; NRS 634A.140)*

*1. The schools or colleges which want to grant a degree of Oriental Medicine to a graduate of the school or college in this state must:*

*(a) Have the students who earned the degree of the bachelor from the accredited school or college in U.S.A. and completed the subjects of physics, biology, chemistry and organic chemistry;*

*(b) Must provide the student the program of the degree of doctor of Oriental medicine which is proven by the board;*

*(c) Submit annually the application with the fee of \$1000 for the approval regarding the curriculum for the degree of doctor of Oriental medicine;*

*(d) Submit any documents to be substantiated regarding each instructor's degree of Ph.D., Dr of Oriental medicine or Dr of Medicine;*

*(e) Submit the transfer affidavits from two different accredited institution offering the same degree;*

*(f) Apply for accreditation of the proposed Nevada campus.*

**NAC 634A.140 Annual registration fees. (NRS 634A.070, 634A.160)**

1. Each person who holds a license to practice Oriental medicine ~~[, acupuncture or herbal medicine]~~ shall pay to the board an annual registration fee of ~~[\$500]~~ *\$1000 for 2004, \$1000 for 2005 and \$400 from the year of 2006.*

~~[2. Each person who holds a license to act as an assistant in acupuncture shall pay to the board an annual registration fee of \$500.]~~

**NAC 634A.165 General schedule of fees. (NRS 634A.070)** The board will charge and collect the following fees:

Original application for licensure as a doctor of Oriental medicine .....	\$400.00
Deposit for initial background investigation .....	300.00
Renewal of license before February 1 .....	<i>\$1000 for 2004, \$1000 for 2005 and \$400 from the year of 2006</i>

**NAC 634A.100 Practical examination of applicant. (NRS 634A.070, 634A.120)**

4. As a part of any *practical* examination, the board may examine an applicant as to his basic knowledge of ~~[anatomy, physiology, bacteriology, biochemistry, pathology and hygiene.]~~

(a) Needling. The board may require a demonstration of needling on a patient or on the applicant himself.

(b) Skills pertaining to sterilization.

(d) Basic medical science concerning anatomy, physiology, pathology, biochemistry, *pharmacology*, bacteriology and communicable diseases.

**NAC 634A.095 Proficiency of applicant in English language. (NRS 634A.070)**

1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, an applicant for a license to practice Oriental medicine must:

(a) Before taking the practical examination, pass the Test of English as a Foreign Language with a score of at least ~~[550]~~ 500; and

*(b) Part of Basic medical science for NAC 634A.100 4 (d)*

*(c) Part of Law and Regulation pertaining to health and safety for NAC 634A.100 4 (e).*

*8. Each part of the practical examination of NAC 634A.100 7(a), (b) and (c) is composed by 100 points totaling three parts making a total of 300 points.*
