

**ADOPTED REGULATION OF THE
DEPARTMENT OF MOTOR VEHICLES**

LCB File No. R078-07

Effective June 17, 2008

AUTHORITY: §1, NRS 482.3675.

A REGULATION relating to motor vehicles, requiring a valid consular identification card to obtain a special license plate for persons appointed as an honorary consul; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Section 1. Chapter 482 of NAC is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:

A person who holds a letter of appointment as an honorary consul and who wishes to obtain or renew a special license plate pursuant to NRS 482.3675 must, in addition to any other requirement, submit to the Department a valid consular identification card issued by the United States Department of State which indicates that the card is issued to an honorary consular officer.

The Department of Motor Vehicles adopted regulations assigned LCB File No. R078-07 which pertain to chapter 482 of the Nevada Administrative Code.

INFORMATIONAL STATEMENT

The following statement is submitted for adopted amendments to Nevada Administrative Code, Chapter 482.

The Department of Motor Vehicles noticed and held public workshops in Carson City on April 7, 2008, and in Las Vegas on April 7, 2008. Public Hearings were held in Carson City on April 8, 2008, and April 8, 2008, in Las Vegas. The purpose of the workshops and hearings were to solicit comments and opinion on proposed regulation changes relating to requiring a valid consular identification card to obtain a special license plate for persons appointed as an honorary consul; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

The notice of public workshops and hearings and complete copies of the proposed regulations were posted on March 4, 2008, at the Nevada State Library and Archives and each office of the Department of Motor Vehicles. In counties where the Department does not maintain an office, the notice was posted at the main office of the public library.

No one attended the hearing. No one testified. No one submitted written comments to the Department.

There was no testimony at the hearing in Carson City or Las Vegas.

The Department will adopt the proposed regulation with one change, added "valid" before "consular identification."

There are no adverse economic effects of this regulation to the Department, local authorities or the public.

There are no other state or government regulations that the proposed regulations duplicate.*
