

**PROPOSED REGULATION OF THE  
STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION**

**LCB File No. R012-08**

January 25, 2008

EXPLANATION – Matter in *italics* is new; matter in brackets ~~[omitted material]~~ is material to be omitted.

AUTHORITY: §§1-3, NRS 385.080 and 389.0195.

A REGULATION relating to education; prescribing a uniform grading scale for pupils enrolled in high school; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Section 1.** Chapter 389 of NAC is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:

*1. The board of trustees of each school district and the governing body of each charter school shall use the following uniform grading scale for pupils enrolled in the school district or charter school in grades 9 to 12, inclusive:*

<i>Course Point Range</i>	<i>Grade</i>	<i>Value</i>
<i>90-100</i>	<i>A</i>	<i>4.0</i>
<i>80-89</i>	<i>B</i>	<i>3.0</i>
<i>70-79</i>	<i>C</i>	<i>2.0</i>
<i>60-69</i>	<i>D</i>	<i>1.0</i>

*2. The grading scale prescribed in subsection 1 must be weighted as follows:*

*(a) For completion of an honors course with a grade of A, B, C or D, a value of 0.025 must be added to the value otherwise prescribed in subsection 1.*

*(b) For completion of an advanced placement course with a grade of A, B, C or D, a value of 0.050 must be added to the value otherwise prescribed in subsection 1.*

*(c) For completion of an international baccalaureate course with a grade of A, B, C or D, a value of 0.050 must be added to the value otherwise prescribed in subsection 1.*

*3. The grade point average of a pupil enrolled in grade 9, 10, 11 or 12 must be computed to the second decimal place. A grade point average that:*

*(a) Is less than 0.005 must be rounded down; and*

*(b) Is 0.005 or higher must be rounded up.*

*4. If a pupil transfers from a high school located outside this State or from a private high school located in this State and enrolls in high school at a school district or charter school in this State, the pupil's transcript must be reviewed and value must be assigned for the grades earned by the pupil in the other state or at the private high school as follows:*

*(a) If the pupil's transcript contains a numerical value for a grade in a course, that numerical value must be assigned.*

*(b) If the pupil's transcript does not contain a numerical value for a grade in a course, the grading scale prescribed in subsection 1 must be applied for that course.*

*(c) If the pupil's transcript contains a notation that the pupil has completed an honors course, an advanced placement course or an international baccalaureate course with a grade of A, B, C or D, the weighted value prescribed in subsection 2 must be applied for that course. If the transcript does not contain such a notation, the grading scale prescribed in subsection 1 must be applied for the course.*

**Sec. 2.** NAC 389.666 is hereby amended to read as follows:

389.666 Units of credit which a pupil may apply toward graduation from high school may be earned:

1. In a public or private high school located in this State.
2. In a public or private high school located outside this State if the school district approves a transfer of the units for this purpose ~~[-]~~ *in accordance with subsection 4 of section 1 of this regulation.*
3. In an institution of higher learning whose academic programs are accredited by a national accrediting organization.
4. In the Nevada Youth Training Center or the ~~[Nevada Girls Training]~~ *Caliente Youth* Center.
5. In a course of independent study conducted in accordance with NAC 389.710 to 389.750, inclusive.

**Sec. 3.** This regulation becomes effective only if LCB File No. R013-08 is not adopted by the State Board of Education.
