AUTHORITY: §1, NRS 391.019.

A REGULATION relating to educational personnel; revising the programs for which a business and industry endorsement may be issued; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Section 1. NAC 391.420 is hereby amended to read as follows:

391.420 The Superintendent of Public Instruction shall issue to a qualified applicant a business and industry endorsement for a specific program included in a career and technical education group. The programs for which an endorsement may be issued are:

**Proposed Amendments to NAC 391.420 – Business and Industry Endorsement; adding
Veterinary Medicine.**

INFORMATIONAL STATEMENT

The following statement is submitted for adopted amendments to Nevada Administrative Code 391:

1. A clear and concise explanation of the need for the adopted regulation.

The need for adopting the regulation is to add an endorsement area for veterinary medicine to allow teachers to obtain the endorsement and place qualified teachers in those classrooms.

2. Description of how public comment was solicited, a summary of public response, and explanation of how other interested persons may obtain a copy of the summary.

Notice of Workshop to Solicit Comments on Proposed Regulations was sent to approximately 200 individuals and educational organizations. A workshop was held on September 12, 2013; with no public comment.

The Notice of Intent to Act Upon a Regulation for public hearing and adoption was sent to approximately 200 individuals and educational organization. A public hearing was conducted on October 17, 2013 to provide the opportunity for comments by affected parties and the public. There was no public comment. The Commission on Professional Standards in Education adopted the proposed regulation.
