

# **PROPOSED REGULATION OF THE BOARD OF WILDLIFE COMMISSIONERS**

## **LCB File No. R057-13**

### **NOTICE OF WORKSHOP TO SOLICIT COMMENTS ON PROPOSED REGULATION**

The Nevada Department of Wildlife is proposing the adoption of regulations pertaining to Chapters 502 and 503 of the Nevada Administrative Code. A workshop has been set at 9:00 a.m., on December 6, 2013 at the City of Reno, 1 East First Street, Reno, Nevada. The purpose of the workshop is to solicit comments from interested persons on the following general topics that may be addressed in the proposed regulation:

**Commission General Regulation 431 – LCB File No. R054-13 – AIS Decal Use Defined -**  
The Commission may adopt a regulation relating to watercraft; revising provisions concerning the aquatic invasive species fee for certain vessels; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Commission General Regulation 432 – LCB File No. R055-13 – Jiggs-Flatware -** The Commission may adopt a regulation relating to wildlife; revising provisions related to waters on which a reduced speed is required; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Commission General Regulation 433 – LCB File No. R056-13 – Remove Fishing Tackle Restrictions –** The Commission may adopt a regulation relating to fishing; removing Andorno Creek, Coleman Creek and the North Fork of Battle Creek from the waters restricted to use only artificial lures with single barbless hooks; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Commission General Regulation 434 – LCB File No. R057-13 – Unit Boundaries -** The Commission may adopt a regulation relating to wildlife management areas and units; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Commission General Regulation 436 – LCB File No. R089-13 – Reciprocal Lake Mead/Lake Mohave – Colorado River -** The Commission may adopt a regulation relating to wildlife; revising provisions relating to licenses required for fishing in the reciprocal waters of the Colorado River, lake Mead and Lake Mohave; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Commission General Regulation 437 – LCB File No. R090-13 – Creating Ewe Hunt -** The Commission may adopt a regulation relating to wildlife; revising provisions relating to the assessment of demerit points for conviction of certain wildlife violations; establishing distinct tags for the hunting of ram and ewe bighorn sheep; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Commission General Regulation 438 – LCB File No. R091-13 – Bonus Point Program -**

The Commission may adopt a regulation relating to wildlife; providing an exception to the prohibition on the submission of applications for hunting tags and bonus points under certain circumstances; prohibiting the award of bonus points for depredation hunts and management hunts; providing for the award of bonus points in the categories of ewes of certain bighorn sheep; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE STATE OF NEVADA BOARD OF WILDLIFE COMMISSIONERS**

The Board of Wildlife Commissioners will hold a public hearing at 9:00 a.m., on December 7, 2013 at the City of Reno, 1 East First St., Reno, Nevada. The purpose of the hearing is to receive comments from all interested persons regarding the adoption of regulations. If a person who is directly affected by the proposed action fails to appear to request to make an oral presentation, the Board of Wildlife Commissioners may proceed immediately to act upon any written submissions.

**Commission General Regulation 431 – LCB File No. R054-13 – AIS Decal Use Defined -**

The Commission may adopt a regulation relating to watercraft; revising provisions concerning the aquatic invasive species fee for certain vessels; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Commission General Regulation 432 – LCB File No. R055-13 – Jiggs-Flatwake -**

The Commission may adopt a regulation relating to wildlife; revising provisions related to waters on which a reduced speed is required; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Restrictions** – The Commission may adopt a regulation relating to fishing; removing Andorno Creek, Coleman Creek and the North Fork of Battle Creek from the waters restricted to use only artificial lures with single barbless hooks; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Mead/Lake Mohave – Colorado River -** The Commission may adopt a regulation relating to wildlife; revising provisions relating to licenses required for fishing in the reciprocal waters of the Colorado River, lake Mead and Lake Mohave; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Commission General Regulation 437 – LCB File No. R090-13 – Creating Ewe Hunt -**

The Commission may adopt a regulation relating to wildlife; revising provisions relating to the assessment of demerit points for conviction of certain wildlife violations; establishing distinct tags for the hunting of ram and ewe bighorn sheep; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Commission General Regulation 438 – LCB File No. R091-13 – Bonus Point Program -**

The Commission may adopt a regulation relating to wildlife; providing an exception to the prohibition on the submission of applications for hunting tags and bonus points under certain circumstances; prohibiting the award of bonus points for depredation hunts and management hunts; providing for the award of bonus points in the categories of ewes of certain bighorn sheep; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.



**NOTICE OF INTENT TO ACT UPON A REGULATION**  
**Notice of Hearing for The (Adoption/Amendment/Repeal) of Regulations of The**  
**Nevada Board of Wildlife Commissioners**

The Board of Wildlife Commissioners will hold a public hearing at 9:00 a.m., December 7, 2013 at the City of Reno, 1 East First Street, Reno, Nevada. The purpose of the hearing is to receive comments from all interested persons regarding the adoption of regulation Commission General Regulation 434 (LCB File No. R057 -13) pertaining to Chapter 504 of the Nevada Administrative Code.

1. The need for and purpose of the proposed regulation: (Description of regulation)  
This regulation legally describes wildlife management units throughout the state used for the management of wildlife species. Big game tags and upland game season regulations use these descriptions to define areas that sportsmen are allowed to harvest game animals in season. Law enforcement uses the descriptions to determine if sportsmen are hunting in legal or open areas and then relies on these descriptions to support disputes in court related to violations.
2. Text of the proposed regulation: See attached.
- 3A. The estimated economic effect of the regulation on the business which it is to regulate:
  - (a) Adverse effect - This regulation is not designed to “regulate” any particular business, rather it is designed to facilitate the management of wildlife within the State of Nevada and provide clearer and updated definitions of wildlife management area and unit boundaries for the benefit of the public who must abide by boundary descriptions, therefore, it should not adversely affect businesses.
  - (b) Beneficial effect – This regulation is not designed to “regulate” any particular business, rather it is designed to facilitate the management of wildlife within the State of Nevada and provide clearer and updated definitions of management area and unit boundaries for the benefit of the public who must abide by boundary descriptions, and therefore it should not provide any beneficial effects to businesses.
  - (c) Immediate effect – This regulation is not designed to “regulate” any particular business, rather it is designed to facilitate the management of wildlife within the State of Nevada and provide clearer and updated definitions of management area and unit boundaries for the benefit of the public who must abide by boundary descriptions, therefore there should not be any immediate effects to businesses.
  - (d) Long-term effect – This regulation is not designed to “regulate” any particular business, rather it is designed to facilitate the management of wildlife within the State of Nevada and provide more clear and updated definitions of management area and unit boundaries for the benefit of the public who must abide by boundary descriptions, therefore there should not be any long-term effects to businesses.

- 3B. The estimated economic effect of the regulation on the public which it is to regulate:
- (a) Adverse effect – This regulation is not expected to adversely affect the public economically because the current boundary descriptions do not affect the public economically.
