PROPOSED REGULATION OF THE BOARD OF WILDLIFE COMMISSIONERS

COMMISSION GENERAL REGULATION 451

EXPLANATION – Matter in *italics* is new; matter in brackets for its material is material to be omitted.

AUTHORITY: §§1 and 2, NRS 501.105, 501.181 and 501.1818.

A REGULATION relating to hunting, fishing and trapping; increase demerit points for hunting, fishing and trapping private property; set demerit points for visitation of traps, snares or similar devices; and other matters relating thereto.

Section 1. NAC 501.200 is herby amended to read as follows:

NAC 501.200 1. A person who is convicted of a wildlife violation will be assessed demerit points pursuant to the following schedule:

- 2. A person who is convicted of committing a wildlife violation that does not appear in the schedule set forth in subsection 1 will be assessed 3 demerit points.
- 3. A person who is convicted of committing a wildlife violation within 60 months after a conviction for the same violation will be assessed double the amount of demerit points listed in the schedule set forth in subsection 1 *and* 2.
- 4. A person who is convicted of committing any four wildlife violations arising out of separate events within a 60-month period will be assessed an extra 12 demerit points.

NOTICE OF INTENT TO ACT UPON A REGULATION Notice of Hearing for the (Adoption/Amendment/Repeal) of Regulations of the Nevada Board of Wildlife Commissioners

The Board of Wildlife Commissioners will hold a public hearing on <u>TBA</u>. The purpose of the hearing is to receive comments from all interested persons regarding the adoption of regulation Commission General Regulation 451 (LCB File No. R088-14) pertaining to Chapter 501 of the Nevada Administrative Code.

1) The need for and purpose of the proposed regulation:

The need for the regulation is to address the issue of chronic repeat offenders of wildlife laws raised during public hearings of the Trapping Committee of the Nevada Board of Wildlife Commissioners (NBWC). The changes to this regulation were proposed by the Trapping Committee. The purposes are threefold:

- Proposed changes would add 6 demerit points for trap visitation violations that are 48 hours over legally prescribed visitation hours. Trap visitation violations less than 48 hours over legally prescribed visitation hours will remain 3 demerit points. The addition of demerit points for extended trap visitation violations will better reflect the severity of this violation of law.
- Wording in the existing regulation failed to allow for doubling of 3 demerit point violation convictions for the same violation in a 60 month period as it does for all 6, 9 and 12 demerit point violations. The language change in the proposed regulation would allow for doubling all 3 point demerit violations as was intended in the existing regulation.
- Changes in the proposed regulation increases demerit points for hunting, fishing or trapping on private property without permission from a 6 to a 12 demerit point violation, increasing the severity of this issue. This increase in demerit points will help deter sportsmen from trespassing on private property.
- 2) Text of the proposed regulation:

- Will this regulation likely impose a direct and significant economic burden upon small business?
 - There are no economic impacts on businesses or groups. This regulation affects individual wildlife law violators, not businesses.
- 4) Will this regulation directly restrict formation, operation or expansion of small business?
 - This regulation does not restrict the formation, operation or expansion of small business.
- 5) Describe how the concerted effort was made to determine the business impact:

This regulation does not regulate small businesses, thus will not have a business impact.

- 6A. Describe the estimated economic effect of the regulation on the business which it is to regulate:
 - (i) Adverse effect This regulation does not regulate a business.
 - (ii) Beneficial effect This regulation does not regulate a business.
- 6B. Describe the estimated economic effect of the regulation on the public which it is to regulate:
 - (i) Adverse effect People who comply with the law will not encounter any change or adverse effect from the proposed language changes in the regulation. Some wildlife law violators may reach 12 demerit points and face revocation of their hunting, fishing and/or trapping privileges sooner with increased demerits; however, the intention of these proposed changes is to lower overall violation rates not to increase revocation rates.
 - (ii) Beneficial effect Private property landowners should encounter fewer trespassing violations on private property.
- 7) Describe the method used to calculate the financial impact (positive, negative, or none) on small businesses:
 - The proposed changes in this regulation only impact individual wildlife law violators and do not impact small businesses.
- 8) The name of the person(s) conducting the analysis of the likely impact of the proposed regulation:
 - Paul Dankowski, Acting Chief Game Warden for NDOW.
- 9) Estimated cost to the Department of Wildlife for enforcement of the proposed regulation:

Game wardens are already enforcing trapping violations. This increase in demerit penalties will create no significant cost increase for enforcement.

Small Business Impact Statement

Commission General Regulation 451 LCB File No. R088-14

Trap Demerit Points

This proposed regulation amendment adds 6 demerit points for a conviction of "fail to visit trap, snare or similar device: 48 or more hours past legal time frame"; increases demerit points for convictions of hunting, fishing or trapping on private property without permission; and allows for the doubling of 3 demerit point violations upon conviction of the same violation within 60 months. Demerit points impact individual wildlife law violators and not small businesses. An individual who accumulates 12 demerit points in a 60 month period may have their hunting, fishing and/or trapping license privileges revoked for a 3 year period.

Although licensed sportsmen can organize into special interest groups, they are licensed as individual sportsmen and are not bound by any laws that regulate small businesses. If an individual sportsman loses a license privilege, businesses would not be significantly impacted.

Sportsmen that participate in trapping can do so as a recreational pursuit, a commercial venture or a combination of both. Although there is a commercial component to trapping, licensing is done on an individual basis and individuals are not required to be licensed or permitted as a business entity.

NDOW concludes that this proposed regulation does not impose a direct and significant economic burden upon nor does it restrict the formation, operation or expansion of a small business.
