

LEGISLATIVE REVIEW OF ADOPTED REGULATION S--NRS 233B.066  
Informational Statement

1. A clear and concise explanation of the need for the adopted regulation.  
This regulation is needed to cover the costs of growers amending their Industrial Hemp permit pursuant to federal law.

A person could actually reduce his/her permit fees by amending their application. This regulation is only enacted at the grower's request. There was no need to change any of the proposed language.
