

**PROPOSED REGULATION OF THE
NEVADA INTERSCHOLASTIC ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION**

(In compliance with Nevada State Statute resulting from passage and approval of SB252 on May 26, 2017, to allow for a student at a school with an enrollment of not more than 30 pupils, which does not offer a particular sport, to gain eligibility at a public school that does offer the sport)

Approved by the NIAA Board of Control June 19, 2017

NAC 386.792 is hereby amended to read as follows:

NAC 386.792 Pupil who attends ~~[private]~~ school that does not offer sanctioned sport. (NRS 386.430)

1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2 ~~[A]~~ a pupil who attends a private school that does not offer a sanctioned sport is not eligible to participate in that sanctioned sport at his or her school of residence.

2. A pupil who is enrolled in a charter school, private school, parochial school or public school may gain eligibility to participate in a sanctioned sport at a public school that offers the sanctioned sport if:

(a) The charter school, private school, parochial school or public school which the pupil attends, enrolls not more than 30 pupils collectively in grades 9, 10, 11 and 12 during a school year;

(b) The pupil resides in the zone of attendance of the school at which the pupil intends to participate in the sanctioned sport or, if the pupil attends a public school that is not a charter school, at the school that is nearest to the residence of the pupil or at a school designated by the Association;

(c) The sanctioned sport is not offered at the charter school, private school, parochial school or public school at which the pupil is enrolled; and

(d) The board of trustees of the school district in which the public school at which the pupil intends to participate is located, approves the participation of the pupil in the sanctioned sport at that public school.

3. The eligibility of a pupil gained pursuant to subsection 2 extends only to the opportunity to try out for and if selected the opportunity to participate on that team at the public school which offers the sanctioned sport. Any pupil gaining eligibility at a school which

the pupil does not attend pursuant to subsection 2, is subject to all other eligibility rules and regulations of both the school the pupil attends and the school at which the pupil participates as well as the district(s) of both schools and the NIAA.

4. The provisions of this section do not supersede nor override the provisions of NAC 386.788, NAC 386.789 or NAC 386.791.
