

**LEGISLATIVE REVIEW OF ADOPTED REGULATIONS AS REQUIRED BY NRS  
233B.066  
LCB FILE R024-20RP1**

The following statement is submitted for adopted amendments to Nevada Administrative Code (NAC)

**1. A clear and concise explanation of the need for the adopted regulation.**

To create regulations that came from AB 472 (2017), which is a comprehensive Juvenile Justice Reform Bill, regarding the collection and dissemination of juvenile justice data (NRS 62H.200).

**2. A description of how public comment was solicited, a summary of public response, and an explanation how other interested persons may obtain a copy of the summary.**

Copies of the proposed regulations, notices of workshop and notices of intent to act upon the regulation were sent by e-mail to persons who were known to have interest in the subject of procedures for the Division to verify that a public or private institution or agency to which a juvenile court commits a child, including, without limitation, a facility for the detention of children, as well as any persons who had specifically requested such notice.
