

INFORMATIONAL STATEMENT
LEGISLATIVE REVIEW OF ADOPTED REGULATIONS
AS REQUIRED BY NRS 233B.066
LCB File R156-20

The following statement is submitted for adopted amendments and repeals of Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) Chapter 538.

1. A clear and concise explanation of the need for the adopted regulation.

The Colorado River Commission of Nevada (Commission) is repealing NAC 538.060 which specifies the physical location of the Commission's office and the hours that the Commission's office will be open. The regulation was added in 1985 and since that time, the Commission has need for flexibility in choosing the precise location in Clark County of its office. The schedule requirement has also become outdated.

2. A description of how public comment was solicited, a summary of public response, and an explanation how other interested persons may obtain a copy of the summary.

Copies of the proposed regulations, notices of workshop and notices of intent to act upon the regulation were sent by email to persons on the CRCNV's service list. These documents were also made available on the CRCNV's website at <http://www.crc.nv.gov/> and made available at the Nevada Public Notice website at <https://notice.nv.gov/> for inspection by members of the public.

One workshop was held on June 25, 2020 in conjunction with this proposed change at which written and oral comment was solicited from stakeholders and the public. No comment was received, and a copy of the minutes is attached as Exhibit B.

On or about January 6, 2021, the Executive Director of the CRCNV issued a Notice of Intent to Act Upon a Regulation. A copy of all materials related to this change may be obtained from the Commission by email to CRCAAdmins@crc.nv.gov.

Comments were solicited from affected businesses in the same manner as they were solicited from the public. The summary may be obtained as instructed in the response to question #2.

6. If the regulation was adopted without changing any part of the proposed regulation, a summary of the reasons for adopting the regulation without change.

The regulation was repealed in its entirety to allow for flexibility in locations and hours of the Commission.

7. The estimated economic effect of the adopted regulation on the businesses which it is to regulate and on the public. These must be stated separately, and each case must include:

There are no economic effects on businesses or the general public.
