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INFORMATIONAL STATEMENT OF ADOPTED REGULATION AS REQUIRED BY ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURES ACT, NRS 233B.066 LCB FILE NO. R022-21

The following statement is submitted for adopted amendments to the Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) Chapter 624 in compliance with NRS 233B.066.

1. A clear and concise explanation of the need for the adopted regulation.

As required by NRS 624.300 and NRS 624.361, the Board previously adopted regulations that establish the standards for determining the amount of an administrative fine imposed upon Nevada contractors that violate certain statutory provisions. The purpose of the proposed regulation is to update the administrative fines laid out in the existing regulation to create fine ranges for new disciplinary violations created or amended during the 2021 legislative session by AB 51, AB 227 and SB 303 to establish an administrative fine range assessment for a contractor who violates subsection 7 of NRS 624.3016 and NRS 624.520. The proposed regulation also makes conforming changes to NAC 624.6932.

2. A description of how public comment was solicited, a summary of the public response and an explanation of how other interested persons may obtain a copy of the summary.

The notice of workshop and notice of hearing to solicit comments on the proposed regulation was posted on the agency's website and on the Nevada Public Notice Website, State Library and Archives, both offices of the Nevada State Contractors Board. Additionally, the notice of workshop and hearing, and the proposed regulation were e-mailed electronically to approximately 461 individuals and organizations who have expressed interest in being kept informed of the Board's meetings. Public comment was solicited in the Notice of Workshop and Hearing which included the proposed regulation and small business impact statement.

Public comment was also solicited at the workshop held on November 9, 2021 and at the hearing held on November 16, 2021 and November 18, 2021. The public workshop and hearing took place at the office of the Board, 2310 Corporate Circle, Suite 200, Henderson, Nevada 89074 with simultaneous videoconferencing with the Board's office, 5390 Kietzke Lane, Suite 102, Reno, Nevada 89511. No public comments were received.
