Commission General Regulation 505**

The following statement is submitted for adopted amendments to Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) Chapter 502.

1. A clear and concise explanation of the need for the adopted regulation:

The regulation is necessary to ensure fairness to all customers of the Department wishing to participate for the potential of purchasing a game tag through the First Come, First Served program. The regulation would allow the Department to apply a suspension from the First Come, First Served program to anyone discovered abusing the system or attempting to create an unfair advantage for themselves.
