Commission General Regulation 508**

The following statement is submitted for adopted amendments to Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) Chapter 502.

**1. A clear and concise explanation of the need for the adopted regulation:**

This regulation is to clarify and revise definitions pertaining to “antler points” and “spike elk” for certain big game mammals. Revised definitions will provide clarity to any hunter with a valid tag for pursuing certain big game mammals and reduce the likelihood of inadvertent infractions committed by hunters.

This regulation does not regulate any small businesses. Therefore, the Department concluded that there would be no small business impact.

The regulation was adopted after discussion at two Commission Meetings and was adopted with one change to the original version.
