Amendments to NAC 391– School Counselor and School Psychologist

INFORMATIONAL STATEMENT

The following statement is submitted for adopted amendments to Nevada Administrative Code 391:

1. **A clear and concise explanation of the need for the adopted regulation.**

The Commission of Professional Standards determined this regulation was needed in response to Senate Bill 151 (2021) to remove an exam barrier for school counselors and school psychologists. The removal of this barrier will allow for greater retention of current school counselors and psychologists and allow additional applicants in the profession to fill current vacancies. This change will expand mental health professionals in Nevada’s schools.

2. **Description of how public comment was solicited, a summary of public response, and an explanation how other interested persons may obtain a copy of the summary.**

Persons wishing to comment upon the proposed action of the Commission on Professional Standards were advised of their right to appear at the scheduled public hearing and their right to address comments, data, views or arguments, in written form, to assistant to the Commission on Professional Standards, Nevada Department of Education 700 E. Fifth St. Suite 100, Carson City, NV 89701. The Commission on Professional Standards must have received written submissions **on or before September 20, 2022**. No persons who are directly affected by the proposed action appeared to request time to make an oral presentation; the Commission on Professional Standards heard and documented the public comment.

A copy of this notice and the regulation to be amended/adopted will be on file at the State Library and Archives, 100 Stewart Street, Carson City, Nevada, for inspection by members of the public during business hours. Upon adoption of any regulation, the agency, if requested to do so by an interested person, either prior to adoption or within 30 days thereafter, will issue a concise statement of the principal reasons for and against its adoption and incorporate therein its reason for overruling the consideration urged against its adoption.

This notice of hearing has been posted at the following locations: Nevada Department of Education, both locations, and Nevada State Library and Archives.

The public response can be summarized as three individuals testified in support of the regulation change as it removes an exam requirement that is not relevant for school psychologists and will allow for more mental health workers to be employed in Nevada’s

Comments were solicited through the public hearing notice of **September 21, 2022**. The Commission on Professional Standards adopted the proposed regulation language at the public hearing held on **September 21, 2022**, as written. The regulations were adopted without change because there was no public comment requesting changes.
