The following statement is submitted for adopted amendments to Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) Chapters 488 and 503.

1. A clear and concise explanation of the need for the adopted regulation:

This regulation is necessary to update fishing restrictions and regulations.

2. Description of how public comment was solicited, a summary of public response, and an explanation of how other interested persons may obtain a copy of the summary:

Public comment for the regulation was solicited during one regulation workshop of the Nevada Board of Wildlife Commissioners (NBWC) on September 23, 2023.

There was one public comment. Jim Evans representing Eureka CABMW stated bait fishing is impacting fish populations in Tonkin Reservoir.
