

**ADOPTED REGULATION OF THE
CHIROPRACTIC PHYSICIANS' BOARD OF NEVADA**

AUTHORITY: §1, NRS 634.014 and 634.030.

A REGULATION relating to chiropractors; interpreting certain provisions relating to chiropractic adjustment; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law sets forth the definition of the term “chiropractic adjustment” as the application of a precisely controlled force applied by hand or mechanical device to a specific focal point of the anatomy. (NRS 634.014) This regulation sets forth the administrative interpretation of the phrase “precisely controlled force” as it is used in NRS 634.014.

Section 1. Chapter 634 of NAC is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:

For the purposes of NRS 634.014, the Board interprets the term “precisely controlled force” to mean:

- 1. One or more thrusts involving both amplitude and velocity, including, without limitation, one or more thrusts involving any combination of high or low amplitude and high or low velocity; or*
- 2. An application of a resistive movement by applying a specific force, without the use of a thrust, to a specific focal point of the anatomy.*
