Anne Loring, Education Alliance of Washoe County, stated as a member of the Board of Directors of the Education Alliance of Washoe County, they support the adoption of the new math standards for high school. She served on the State Math Standards writing team in 1998 when the Legislature passed the Nevada Education Reform Act in 1998. At that time the standards written and approved were that students were to be proficient in math through Algebra I and Geometry by the time they graduated from high school. That was a significant increase in expectations 14 years ago. The standards today raise the expectation to now include Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II and one course beyond, which will better prepare students to be career and college ready. The Education Alliance of Washoe County provided input during development

of the common core math standards many years ago and has endorsed the final result. Since then they have worked for two years on defining very precisely, in the community, what career and college readiness means. Based on all of the work, they strongly support these revisions to NAC.
