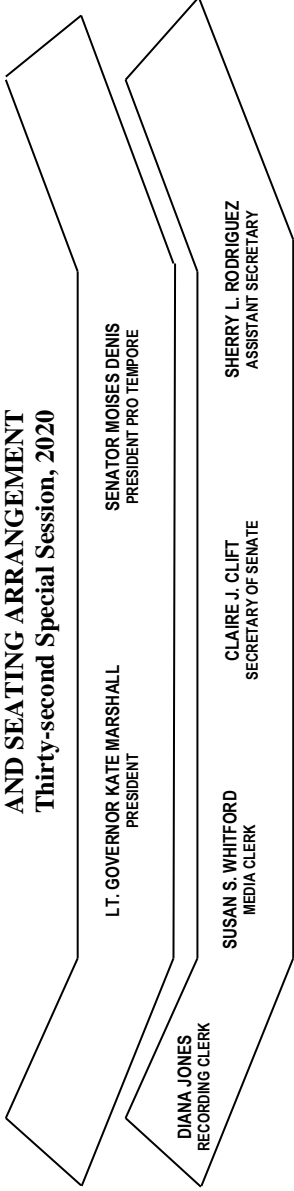

Enacted bills are those that were either passed by the Legislature and signed into law by the Governor or were enacted into law pursuant to the *Nevada Constitution*, Article 4, section 35. All enacted bills have been assigned a chapter number in the *Statutes of Nevada*.

Enacted joint resolutions are those passed by the Legislature and assigned a file number in the *Statutes of Nevada*. Joint resolutions, which seek to amend the *Nevada Constitution*, must be passed by two Sessions of the Legislature and then be submitted to the people for a vote.

Enacted concurrent and one-house resolutions are those adopted by the Legislature and assigned a file number in the *Statutes of Nevada*.
