SUMMARY—Authorizes and provides funding for certain projects of capital improvement. (BDR S-11)

AN ACT relating to projects of capital improvement; authorizing certain expenditures for such projects of the Executive and Legislative Departments of the State Government; levying a property tax to support the Consolidated Bond Interest and Redemption Fund; making appropriations; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** There is hereby appropriated from the State General
2 Fund to the State Public Works Division of the Department of
3 Administration the sum of \$422,153,108 to support the Division in
4 carrying out the program of capital improvements as summarized in
5 this section. The amount is allocated to projects numbered and
6 described in the Executive Budget for the 2023-2025 biennium or
7 otherwise described as follows:

Any remaining balance of any appropriation made by section 1 of this act must not be committed for expenditure after June 30, 2027, by the entity to which the appropriation is made or any entity to which money from the appropriation is granted or otherwise transferred in any manner, and any portion of the appropriated money remaining must not be spent for any purpose after September 17, 2027, by either the entity to which the money was appropriated or the entity to which the money was subsequently granted or transferred, and must be reverted to the State General Fund on or before September 17, 2027.

Sec. 3. There is hereby appropriated from the State Highway Fund to the State Public Works Division of the Department of Administration the sum of \$11,462,536 to support the Division in carrying out the program of capital improvements summarized in this section. The amount is allocated to projects numbered and described in the Executive Budget for the 2023-2025 biennium or otherwise described as follows:

22 **Sec. 4.** Any remaining balance of any appropriation made by
23 section 3 of this act must not be committed for expenditure after
24 June 30, 2027, by the entity to which the appropriation is made or
25 any entity to which money from the appropriation is granted or
26 otherwise transferred in any manner, and any portion of the
27 appropriated money remaining must not be spent for any purpose
28 after September 17, 2027, by either the entity to which the money
29 was appropriated or the entity to which the money was subsequently
30 granted or transferred, and must be reverted to the State Highway
31 Fund on or before September 17, 2027.

32 **Sec. 5.** The amounts appropriated by section 3 of this act from
33 the State Highway Fund must be allocated by the State Controller as
34 the money is required for the projects listed in section 3 of this act
35 and must not be transferred to those projects until required to make
36 contract payments.

37 **Sec. 6.** The State Board of Finance shall issue general
38 obligation bonds of the State of Nevada in the face amount of not
39 more than \$533,695,336 for capital improvements summarized in
40 this section and use proceeds of general obligation bonds of the
41 State of Nevada previously issued in the amount of \$5,000,000
42 which are reallocated for capital improvements summarized in this
43 section. The capital improvements summarized in this section are to
44 be paid with proceeds of general obligation bonds of the State of
45 Nevada in an amount not to exceed \$538,695,336, provided that



1 \$5,000,000 of the proceeds of general obligation bonds of the State
 2 of Nevada issued pursuant to section 6 of chapter 542, Statutes of
 3 Nevada 2019, at page 3309, as amended by section 2 of chapter 3,
 4 Statutes of Nevada 2020, 31st Special Session, at page 18, shall be
 5 reallocated to the capital improvements summarized in this section
 6 and spent before the expenditure of the proceeds of general
 7 obligation bonds of the State of Nevada issued pursuant to this
 8 section. The provisions of the State Securities Law, NRS 349.150 to
 9 349.364, inclusive, apply to the bonds authorized by this section. As
 10 used in this section, "proceeds of general obligation bonds" means
 11 amounts received from the sale of an issue and any accrued interest
 12 thereon. The amounts are allocated to projects numbered and
 13 identified in the Executive Budget for the 2023-2025 biennium or
 14 otherwise described as follows:

Sec. 7. Any remaining balance of the allocated amounts authorized in section 6 of this act must not be committed for expenditure after June 30, 2027, and must be reverted to the Bond Interest and Redemption Account in the Consolidated Bond Interest and Redemption Fund on or before September 17, 2027.



Sec. 8. 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, the State Board of Finance shall issue general obligation bonds of the State of Nevada in the face amount of not more than \$111,304,685, the proceeds of which must be used for projects identified in this subsection. The provisions of the State Securities Law, NRS 349.150 to 349.364, inclusive, apply to the bonds authorized by this subsection. As used in this subsection, “proceeds” means amounts received from the sale of an issue of the general obligation bonds and any accrued interest thereon. The amounts are allocated to projects numbered and identified in the Executive Budget for the 2023-2025 biennium or otherwise described as follows:

2. The State Board of Finance shall not issue the bonds described in subsection 1 unless the Board determines that the money budgeted or to be budgeted pursuant to subsection 3 will be sufficient to pay the bond repayment costs of the bonds authorized by subsection 1. In making its determination under this subsection, the State Board of Finance shall be entitled to rely on a certification of the Director of the Office of Finance in the Office of the Governor that the money budgeted and to be budgeted pursuant to subsection 3 will be sufficient to pay the bond repayment costs of the bonds authorized by subsection 1. Any determination made by the State Board of Finance under this subsection shall be conclusive. As used in this subsection, “bond repayment costs” means the



1 principal of and interest on the bonds and any other costs related to
2 the payment of the bonds or compliance with covenants made in
3 connection with those bonds, as estimated by the State Treasurer.

4 3. The Legislature intends that the annual bond repayment
5 costs of the bonds authorized by subsection 1, and any bonds
6 directly or indirectly, through a series of refundings, refunding those
7 bonds, will be paid from annually available money in the State
8 Highway Fund. The Director of the Office of Finance in the Office
9 of the Governor is hereby directed to budget for payment of such
10 bond repayment costs from the State Highway Fund in each budget
11 or other spending plan presented to the Legislature for the
12 expenditure of amounts in the State Highway Fund after the
13 effective date of this section until the bonds authorized by
14 subsection 1 and any bonds directly or indirectly refunding those
15 bonds are no longer outstanding. The money so budgeted to pay the
16 annual bond repayment costs of the bonds authorized by subsection
17 1, and any bonds directly or indirectly, through a series of
18 refundings, refunding those bonds, are hereby appropriated in each
19 year to the Consolidated Bond Interest and Redemption Fund to pay
20 such bond repayment costs. As used in this subsection, "annually
21 available money in the State Highway Fund" means money
22 remaining in the State Highway Fund in any year after all amounts
23 required to pay bonds issued pursuant to NRS 408.273 in that year
24 have been paid or provision for such payment has been made.

25 **Sec. 9.** Any remaining balance of the allocated amounts
26 authorized in section 8 of this act must not be committed for
27 expenditure after June 30, 2027, and must be reverted to the Bond
28 Interest and Redemption Account in the Consolidated Bond Interest
29 and Redemption Fund on or before September 17, 2027.

30 **Sec. 10.** 1. The State Board of Finance may issue the bonds
31 authorized pursuant to sections 6 and 8 of this act at the time
32 deemed appropriate by the Board based on the schedule established
33 for the completion of the projects described in those sections.

34 2. The State Controller may advance temporarily from the
35 State General Fund, upon the approval of the Director of the Office
36 of Finance in the Office of the Governor, to the State Public Works
37 Division of the Department of Administration, until the date on
38 which the bonds authorized by section 6 of this act are sold,
39 amounts necessary to facilitate, as applicable, the purchase of
40 buildings or the start of the projects enumerated in section 6 of this
41 act. The amounts temporarily advanced by the State Controller must
42 be advanced as the money is required for the projects and must not
43 be transferred to the projects from the State General Fund until
44 required to make contract payments. The advanced amounts must be
45 repaid immediately to the State General Fund upon the issuance of



1 the bonds or not later than the last business day in August
2 immediately following the end of the fiscal year during which the
3 advance is made.

4 3. The State Controller may advance temporarily from the
5 State Highway Fund, upon the approval of the Director of the Office
6 of Finance in the Office of the Governor, to the State Public Works
7 Division of the Department of Administration, until the date on
8 which the bonds authorized by section 8 of this act are sold,
9 amounts necessary to facilitate the start of the projects enumerated
10 in section 8 of this act. The amounts temporarily advanced by the
11 State Controller must be advanced as the money is required for the
12 projects and must not be transferred to the projects from the State
13 Highway Fund until required to make contract payments. The
14 advanced amounts must be repaid immediately to the State Highway
15 Fund upon the issuance of the bonds or not later than the last
16 business day in August immediately following the end of the fiscal
17 year during which the advance is made.

18 4. The Director of the Office of Finance in the Office of the
19 Governor shall provide written notification to the State Controller,
20 the State Treasurer and the Senate and Assembly Fiscal Analysts
21 of the Fiscal Analysis Division of the Legislative Counsel Bureau of
22 the approval of any advance from the State General Fund or the
23 State Highway Fund to the State Public Works Division of the
24 Department of Administration pursuant to subsection 2 or 3. The
25 Director of the Office of Finance in the Office of the Governor shall
26 provide a reconciliation to the Senate and Assembly Fiscal Analysts
27 of the Fiscal Analysis Division of the Legislative Counsel Bureau of
28 any advance authorized from the State General Fund or the State
29 Highway Fund and any repayment to the State General Fund or the
30 State Highway Fund made during any fiscal year during the 2023-
31 2025 biennium. The reconciliation must be provided not later than
32 the last business day in August immediately following the end of the
33 fiscal year during which an advance is made.

34 **Sec. 11.** 1. Expenditure of the following sums not
35 appropriated from the State General Fund or the State Highway
36 Fund is hereby authorized for the following projects numbered and

12 from the date on which the money was received by the Culinary
13 Academy of Las Vegas through December 1, 2024;

14 (b) Prepare and transmit a final report to the Interim Finance
15 Committee on or before September 19, 2025, that describes each
16 expenditure made from the money appropriated by subsection 1
17 from the date on which the money was received by the Culinary
18 Academy of Las Vegas through June 30, 2025; and

19 (c) Upon request of the Legislative Commission, make available
20 to the Legislative Auditor any of the books, accounts, claims,
21 reports, vouchers or other records of information, confidential or
22 otherwise, of the Culinary Academy of Las Vegas, regardless of
23 their form or location, that the Legislative Auditor deems necessary
24 to conduct an audit of the use of the money appropriated pursuant to
25 subsection 1.

26 3. Any remaining balance of the appropriation made by
27 subsection 1 must not be committed for expenditure after June 30,
28 2025, by the entity to which the appropriation is made or any entity
29 to which money from the appropriation is granted or otherwise
30 transferred in any manner, and any portion of the appropriated
31 money remaining must not be spent for any purpose after
32 September 19, 2025, by either the entity to which the money was
33 appropriated or the entity to which the money was subsequently
34 granted or transferred, and must be reverted to the State General
35 Fund on or before September 19, 2025.

36 **Sec. 34.** 1. This section and sections 1 to 32, inclusive, of
37 this act become effective upon passage and approval.

38 2. Section 33 of this act becomes effective on June 30, 2023, if
39 and only if Assembly Bill No. 525 and Senate Bill No. 341 of the
40 82nd session of the Legislature are not enacted into law on or before
41 that date.
