INTRODUCTION, FIRST READING AND REFERENCE

Assembly Bill No. 193—AN ACT relating to labor; revising provisions relating to payment for each hour of work by an employee; authorizing an employer to round the time actually worked by an employee; authorizing an employer to disregard certain time recorded by an employee; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Assemblyman Kirner moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Commerce and Labor.

Assembly Bill No. 196—AN ACT relating to the Attorney General; requiring the Attorney General, under certain circumstances, to commence an action to protect and secure the rights of residents of this State under the Second Amendment to the United States Constitution; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Assemblyman Wheeler moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Government Affairs.

Assembly Bill No. 197—AN ACT relating to juvenile delinquents; revising the manner in which certain children who are adjudicated delinquent for certain acts are required to register as a juvenile sex offender; requiring the Attorney General to establish guidelines and procedures for community notification concerning juvenile sex offenders; revising which juvenile sex offenders may be subject to registration and community notification in the manner provided for adult sex offenders; requiring the juvenile court to retain jurisdiction over all children who are subject to registration and community notification as sex offenders and to determine when such children may be relieved of such requirements; providing a penalty; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Assemblyman Hambrick moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

Motion carried.

By Assemblymen Ellison, Hambrick, Fiore, Hansen, Hickey, Livermore, Martin, Oscarson, Stewart, Wheeler, and Woodbury; Senators Gustavson and Goicoechea:

Assembly Bill No. 198—AN ACT relating to taxicabs; eliminating the requirement that a vehicle acquired for use as a taxicab in certain counties must be new or must have not more than 30,000 miles on its odometer; eliminating the requirement that a taxicab operated in certain counties must be removed from operation after a certain period of use; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Assemblyman Ellison moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Transportation.

By the Committee on Commerce and Labor:

Assembly Bill No. 199—AN ACT relating to energy; authorizing the Colorado River Commission of Nevada to sell electricity and provide transmission service and distribution service to certain new customers; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Assemblyman Bobzien moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Commerce and Labor.

Assembly Bill No. 200—AN ACT relating to food establishments; revising the definition of “food establishment” for purposes of provisions regulating such establishments; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Assemblyman Hardy moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Health and Human Services.

By Assemblyman Daly:

Assembly Bill No. 201—AN ACT relating to taxation; increasing the rate of assessment of property; temporarily providing for the allocation and use of certain revenue attributable to the increase in the rate of assessment; revising the provisions governing the distribution of the proceeds of certain taxes through the Local Government Tax Distribution Account; revising the provisions governing certain partial abatements of property taxes; repealing the prohibition against certain agreements between local governments regarding the establishment of a combined property tax rate; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Assemblyman Daly moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Taxation.

By the Committee on Judiciary:

Assembly Bill No. 202—AN ACT relating to juvenile justice; revising the list of offenses that are excluded from the original jurisdiction of the juvenile court; authorizing a child who is certified for adult criminal proceedings to petition the court for placement in a state juvenile detention facility during the pendency of the proceeding; requiring a child who is sentenced to a term of imprisonment to serve the term in a state juvenile detention facility until he or she reaches the age of 18 years; providing for parole eligibility at the age of 25 years for certain prisoners; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Assemblyman Frierson moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Judiciary.
